Please remember to drive slowly in and around the school area when dropping off and picking up your children. Kindergarten Registration:

If you have a child who will turn 4 years old before the end of 2023, they are eligible to begin school in September. There are several ways you can register for kindergarten. We encourage you to register early so that you reserve a spot at RPPS.Families can register using the following options:

• Online - Families can access the online Kindergarten registration information at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten</u> > Registration. It is recommended that families use a laptop or a desktop, rather than a mobile device to complete this registration.

- By email Families can download the <u>Elementary School Registration Form</u> at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten</u> and email the completed form to their school email address.
- By phone Families can request support to complete the registration form on their behalf by collecting the required information by phone. Families can request an interpreter, if needed, during this phone conversation.

• In-person at the school - Families may visit the school office to drop off or complete a registration form.

Registration Verification Process

Following submission of a registration package, schools will contact families to schedule an appointment for Document Verification.

Dear Parents/Guardians of Future BHSS students,

In September 2023, Bill Hogarth Secondary School will be introducing a 1:1 (Bring Your Own Device) program for all our students. This program has each student bring their own digital device to school each day to support the use of digital tools in class to enrich their learning environment.

What is the 1:1 Program?

- An approach to education that revolves around improving student learning and engagement with the integration of technology into daily school life.
- Students enhance their critical thinking skills as creators with technology rather than passive consumers of technology
- All students are required to have access to a laptop, chromebook or tablet PC for education purposes. Students take ownership of their device and will not be required to share with others.
- Students are provided a locker to store their device to ensure its safe keeping while at school and not in use.

Benefits of 1:1 Learning:

- Increases collaboration within and beyond the classroom
- Provides immediate access to resources and information
- Improves organization and planning
- Promotes self-initiated learning and increases independence
- Develops the technological know-how students will need in their future endeavours

Technology Requirements:

- A cell phone is not a 1:1 device
- Students will not be required to purchase software. If they take a course that uses proprietary software, the school will provide resources for access.
- Families can choose with their child the device that is most appropriate for them. Chromebooks will suffice for this program.
- Battery life is the most important component for your child's device
