At the start of each school year, schools share with families a package of information about the school. Families will also receive a copy of the <u>Guide to the School Year</u> booklet in the coming weeks. We also ask families to complete some important forms. These forms are now available online.

Please complete and submit these online School Start-Up Formsthrough your child's YRDSB Google account.

- · You can access your child's YRDSB Google account via a web browser. For best results, use a computer rather than a mobile phone.
- The username is your child's YRDSB Student Number. Your child will receive their login information from the school at the start of the year. If you or your child do not know the password to log in to their Google account, please contact your child's teacher or the school office.
- Frequently asked questions and additional information on <u>how to complete the forms</u> are available on the Board website under <u>Family Resources</u> (click on the "Need Help" link for Family Start-Up Forms.

It is important that these forms are completed as soon as possible at the start of the school year. There are both mandatory and optional forms. The forms are to be completed for all students, whether they are attending school in person or participating in remote, online learning. Your child's school will access the information.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Re: Class Re-Organization for September 26, 2022

As you may know, the Government of Ontario requires all school boards in Ontario to have 20 or fewer students in 90% of primary classes (Grade 1 to Grade 3); up to 10% of primary classes may have up to 23 students. At the same time, we are required to show the average size of Grade 4-8 classes across our Board. Early Learning Kindergarten programs have approximately 26 students, with one teacher and one designated early childhood educator in each class.

Staff have worked diligently to organize classes to provide the best program for each child and to comply with the maximum class size requirements. Please note however that there may be changes prior to September 26, 2022 (the date on which class sizes will be reported to the Ministry of Education).

You will be informed of any changes to your child's class placement through the school principal.

Rest assured that we are taking all steps possible to minimize disruption in our schools.

Saturday, Sunday, & following Saturday Caregiver and first aid skills for youth in grades 5 to 8.

Babysitting promises to deepen and enhance the responsibility that older youth feel when caring for younger children. The curriculum includes new science for giving appropriate care in an emergency.

(2 hour and 20 min online sessions plus homework over 2 days) For youth in grades 3, 4 and 5.

Participants learn the skills needed to stay safe on their own at home, how to respond to unexpected situations (such as strangers or visitors knocking on the door), how to give first aid treatment, and when and how to call 911. Whether in the community or alone, this course is a must-take if you want your children to have better tools for staying safe.

We welcome everyone to the 2022-2023 Indigenous Languages and International Languages (ILIL) program year and thank you for your continued support and patience.

We are also excited to welcome our students and families back to in-person instruction onsite for the 2022-2023 elementary program year. While we will be returning to the same ILIL school locations pre-pandemic, there may be some changes to the locations in which specific languages are offered.

NEW Elementary Online/Remote Options:

To better serve our language learning community, we have added online /remote learning options on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. Online learning does not require students and teachers to be face-to-face at a school site. Classes occur online using a synchronous and asynchronous model, with check-in opportunities with the teacher. Families will be contacted with updates as necessary.
