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New Screening Tool

A new <u>screening tool</u> for the 2021-2022 school year has been provided by York Region Public Health (please click on Check for Symptoms Daily). This screening tool replaces previous versions and all students and staff must complete the screening prior to attending any YRDSB school or facility. Parents/guardians of elementary students (or the students themselves depending on their age) will have to provide confirmation of a successful screening as follows:

- Parents/Guardians of Elementary students are required to complete on-line self-assessment<u>COVID-19</u> <u>School and Child-Care Screening Tool</u> (please click on Check for Symptoms Daily), prior to their child entering the school
- 2. Upon completion of the self-assessment, Parents/Guardians will complete the response to the question: "Have you completed the self-screening tool?" in the <u>Confirmation Form</u> using their child's GAPPS account login information. Information on how to access your child's GAPPS account is available on the <u>Board's website</u>. If you do not have a student number/username, one will be provided by your child's teacher.

Any students who are experiencing symptoms consistent with COVID-19 as identified in the screening tool (not related to a COVID-19 vaccine) or answer yes to any of the screening questions, must not enter any school and follow the guidance in the screening tool. Our office staff must follow up with every student who does not submit a Confirmation Form. Please help reduce their workload by ensuring you submit every morning.

The Hybrid Classroom

As we embark on a new way of teaching and learning, the Hybrid Model, staff have been busy learning how best to support their students learning face to face at the same time as those learning virtually from home. Like any new system, it will take time to iron out the kinks! Thank you for your patience as we learn what works best. A few points about hybrid learning:

- Students learning remotely should use both their audio and video when participating in collaborative activities in order to maximize connections with their peers and teacher(s) duringGoogle Meet/Zoom sessions. The use of a blurred background or stock image for the virtual background is recommended.
- Educators may set up activities and spaces where face-to-face and remote students are working together in
 pairs or small groups, e.g., small group activities to support collaborative problem solving. Students will have
 knowledge of specific areas of the classroom where the camera will usually be pointed, e.g., front or corner
 of the classroom.
- Educators will be equipped with headsets and a web-camera for the purpose of supporting remote learners
 to see and hear lessons; the web-camera will generally point toward the teacher and the
 whiteboard/chalkboard and at times, may capture the voices/images of students learning remotely or
 face-to-to-face for learning purposes.
- Subjects such as physical education and outdoor learning will be asynchronous for our virtual learners as it is not possible to have a google meet during these times.

Reporting an Absence

Our school operates a safe arrival program that requires that we check the whereabouts of all students who are absent each day. It is important that parent(s)/guardian(s) let us know if their child is going to be absent. We have a 24 hour absence reporting line. When you call in please clearly state your child's name and state their teacher's name as well. You may leave a message anytime at: (905) 350-0005. You may also report an absence through Edsby. Even if your child is a virtual learner, you must report their absence. When you don't report, our office staff has to phone every family to ensure they are accounted for.

Parking

Please remember to use our kiss'n ride at the side of the school when you are dropping off your children in the morning. Staff on duty will watch them exit the car and head to their entry door, allowing you to pull forward and exit the loop. If you would like to park and walk your child to their door or to the kindergarten play area, please park on the street as our parking lot is for staff members only. Thank you!
