### **EARTH HOUR 60**

Saturday, March 26, 8:30 - 9:30pm

Earth Hour began in 2007 in Sydney, Australia and quickly grew to a global phenomenon. By 2009, Earth Hour grew to over 4,000 cities, including 73 national capitals and nine of the world's 10 most populated cities. In Canada, over half of the Canadian adult population (over 10 million people) switched off their lights!

The goal is to get as many individuals and businesses as possible to turn off their lights for one hour to raise awareness about climate change and demonstrate that people are ready to take personal action.

Everyone in Canada is encouraged to participate. Let's support the efforts of the World Wildlife Fund Canada. Participating in Earth Hour is a simple way to show that you want to be a part of the solution and sends a powerful message to others that, together, our small actions can make a big difference.

Here at Schomberg we observed Earth Day on Friday, March 25, by turning off some of our electrical devices and lights between 1:40 and 2:40 p.m. Earth Hour is a straightforward way for York Region's municipalities and citizens to take action and celebrate our existing efforts to fight climate change. # York Region District School Board 2022-2023 School Year

The Board knows that families may have questions about what to expect during the next school year. Given the numerous benefits of in-person learning, YRDSB is planning for our students to attend school in person, while following all appropriate measures to protect the health and safety of students, staff and families.

The Ministry of Education has directed school boards to provide a remote learning option for students for 202223. For next year, we will have an Elementary Virtual School and Secondary Virtual School. The parameters of the virtual schools are currently being reviewed. Our planned response to the pandemic for next school year does not include a "hybrid" model of learning.

Please note the following information as you begin to contemplate your decisions for next year:  $\Box$  In April 2022, students and families will be asked to select their learning model for the entire 2022-2023 school year. We will share information with you in the coming weeks about when and how to select your learning model and other information to help you make an informed decision. This will include start and end times, programs and offerings, etc.  $\Box$  Families and students should expect to remain in the selected model for the full school year.  $\Box$  Elementary Virtual Schools will offer French Immersion, Community Classes and Gifted programming.

We will continue to share updates with you as it becomes available to help you make an informed decision for the 2022-2023 school year.

To assist Canadians concerned about their loved ones in Ukraine, effective immediately, the following phone providers will be waiving all Home Phone and consumer Mobility Postpaid Long Distance charges for calls from Canada to Ukraine until Mar. 31, 2022:

• Bell Canada • Fido - including long distance SMS to Ukraine and roaming fees are also waived. • Freedom Mobile - including long distance SMS to Ukraine and roaming fees are also waived. • Rogers - including long distance SMS to Ukraine and roaming fees are also waived. • Telus - waiving all additional charges for long-distance calls and texts to Ukraine until March 12th • Virgin Plus

These changes will be applied automatically during the month of March. No action is required by customers.
