Hotmail and YRDSB Issues

Student Absences

SEPTEMBER SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION NOTICE

Each summer, Student Transportation Services of York Region (STSYR) makes adjustments to bus route schedules to accommodate new students and new school openings. **As a result, some students may experience changes in their bus schedule or route number**. Please confirm bus information for September by checking www.schoolbuscity.com as of August 20. If you are unable to find the information you require, please contact your school.

During the first two weeks of school, students should arrive at their bus stop *10 minutes early*. After this, students are asked to arrive 5 minutes early as each bus route develops its regular routine and service times

Transportation Eligibility

In accordance with Board policies, transportation is provided for students who live within their designated Home School attendance area and outside their grade appropriate Non-Transportation Zone. Transportation eligibility changes throughout a student's school career. <u>Please note students currently in Grade 3 and Grade 8 who</u> use school bus service may see a change in their eligibility as they transition to Grade 4 and Grade 9.

Eligibility JK- Grade 8

- All YRDSB students in JK Grade 3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation.
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4 8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation.

Eligibility Grade 9-12

 All YRDSB students in Grades 9 - 12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

Parents of students entering Grade 4 and Grade 9 may confirm their transportation eligibility by accessing the Find Your Bus Stop tab at www.schoolbuscity.com. Students not eligible for transportation who wish to obtain York Region Transit information should visit their website at www.yrt.ca or phone 1-866-668-3978.


SPS will be holding our 9th Annual 'Elf Day' Holiday Bazaar on Saturday, December 8th. More information will be sent out at a later date.

SAFETY AWARENESS WEEK

September 24th to 28th, 2018

During safety awareness week, students and staff will be practicing several emergency drills:

- ♦ Fire Drill
- ❖ Lockdown Drill A Lockdown is initiated immediately if there is a major incident or threat of violence within a school. All exterior doors remain locked and students, staff and building occupants follow Lockdown procedures as per training/practice to remain quiet and out of site within the school. No one is permitted entrance into the building during this time. Once Police arrive, they are in charge
- ❖ Hold and Secure Drill A Hold and Secure is initiated when the school is advised by Police that there is an adverse condition or a possible threat in the area <u>outside</u> of a school (i.e. in the general vicinity/community). During a Hold and Secure no one may leave or enter the building. Classes that are outside are brought inside the school. Students, staff and building occupants continue regular routines <u>within the school</u>. A Hold and Secure remains in place until Police/other official confirms the emergency is over.

Students and staff review emergency procedures throughout the school year. In addition, we hold scheduled practices of emergency drills throughout the school year:

- ➤ Six Fire Drill practices (three during Term 1 and three during Term 2)
- Two Lockdown practice drills (one during each Term)
- One Hold and Secure drill (during Term 1)

In the case of an **Emergency Evacuation** of the school Sharon Public School has **two reunification locations** (sites where parents can meet with their children after an incident has been resolved by Police, but the building is still under their control) that we would like parents to be aware of:
