Student Transportation Services of York Region is responsible for ensuring all students receive transportation service in accordance with Board Policy.

Due to the re-location of Our Lady of Good Council CES <u>all</u> routes servicing Sharon PS will require adjustment.

Please note that existing stop locations will remain the same, however route numbers and/or school bus operators may change.

Stop times are approximate and can vary during the first 2 weeks of school, please have your child at the bus stop a minimum of 10 minutes before the stop time.

Helpful Student Transportation Tips for Parents/Guardians

Please consider the following helpful tips and suggestions when preparing for your child to ride the bus to and from school:

- Often parents want to drive children to school on the first day. STS recommends that if you drive your children to school the first day, you also pick them up from school.
- Communicate any changes to daycare locations to your child's school prior to the start of the school year to ensure your child is placed on the correct bus
- Ensure your grade JK-1 child has a Safe Rider sticker affixed to their backpack to help ensure they are dropped-off at the correct bus stop location.
- JK, SK and Grade 1 students must be met at the bus stop by a parent/guardian.
- Keep current phone numbers and emergency contact details with the school office.
- Record the bus company name and route # for your child and keep in a safe and accessible place.
- Have an alternative arrangement for your child should unexpected circumstances such as traffic delay or any other emergency occurs.

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SEPTEMBER SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION NOTICE

Each summer, Student Transportation Services of York Region (STSYR) makes adjustments to bus route schedules to accommodate new students and new school openings. As a result, some students may experience changes in their bus schedule or route number. Please confirm bus information for September by checking <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u> as of August 21. If you are unable to find the information you require, please contact your school.

During the first two weeks of school, students should arrive at their bus stop 10 minutes early. After this, students are asked to arrive 5 minutes early as each bus route develops its regular routine and service times

Transportation Eligibility

In accordance with Board policies, transportation is provided for students who live within their designated Home School attendance area and outside their grade appropriate Non-Transportation Zone. Transportation eligibility changes throughout a student's school career. <u>Please note students currently in Grade 3 and Grade 8 who use</u> <u>school bus service may see a change in their eligibility as they transition to</u> <u>Grade 4 and Grade 9.</u>

Eligibility JK- Grade 8

- All YRDSB students in JK Grade 3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation.
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4 8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation.

Eligibility Grade 9-12

 All YRDSB students in Grades 9 - 12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

Parents of students entering Grade 4 and Grade 9 may confirm their transportation eligibility by accessing the Find Your Bus Stop tab at <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u>. Students not eligible for transportation who wish to obtain York Region Transit information should visit their website at <u>www.yrt.ca</u> or phone 1-866-668-3978.

Are You Interested In Donating Your Hair To Cancer?

As part of a Passion Project assignment for Mrs.Godden's grade 8 class this year, Mrs. Godden has created her own Passion Project. Mrs.Godden lost her Sister-in-Law to Cancer two years ago this September. In memory of her Sister-in-Law and Mother- in- Law who both lost their battles to Cancer, as well as so many others, Mrs. Godden is planning a fundraiser for the Canadian Cancer Society. She will also be donating her hair for the cause. The hair donated will be used to make wigs for people battling cancer. The date of the "Big Cut" will be on **Friday, September 29th** and Mrs.Godden is looking for others to join her on that day that wish to donate their hair. What she would like to do is have all people interested attend an assembly where there will be a mass cut of hair at the same time.

The rules for hair donations to the Canadian Cancer Society are as follows:

Hair must be a minimum 8 inches in length Hair must be clean, dry and not swept off the floor Donations to British Columbia are accepted for chemically treated hair or gray hair.

York Region Public Health Information

In the 2017/18 school year, York Region Public Health will visit all elementary schools to provide school immunization clinics to Grade 7 students. The clinics offer vaccines for Hepatitis B, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) and Meningococcal A, C, Y, W-135 at no cost.

Under the Immunization of School Pupils Act, meningococcal vaccine is required for school attendance, unless an exemption is filed with public health. Hepatitis B and HPV vaccines are recommended, but not required for school attendance.

Parents of students entering Grade 7 in fall 2017 will receive consent forms in the mail in June. Please complete the consent form and return it to York Region Public Health to allow your child to participate in the immunization clinics. Detailed instructions can be found on the forms and accompanying letter. If the consent form is not completed, your child will not be able to receive vaccines at the clinic.

Parents and guardians who do not consent should still complete the forms and return them, indicating that you do not authorize York Region Public Health to immunize your child.

Visit <u>york.ca/immunizations</u> and click on School Immunization Clinics for more information.

Did you know? If your child has missed a required vaccination on Ontario's routine immunization schedule, he/she can receive the vaccine at one of York Region Public Health's Community Immunization Clinics. These evening clinics are offered throughout the summer, giving students the opportunity to catch up before returning to school.
