SPPS SCHOOL COUNCIL UPDATE

The Silver Pines School Council had our second meeting on January 12th. Below is a brief summary of decisions made to support the school and enhance programming. A full record of our meeting notes are available on the school website on the Parent page.

- 1) **In-school Field Trip financial support:**
School Council supported financing a reduced cost for one in-school field trip per class to a cost of \$10/student. Additional funding was provided for families who may require additional financial support.
- 2) **Approved Leveled Readers in Primary classrooms:**
School Council supported upgrading and topping up the Primary division leveled reading books.

Inclement Weather (IW) Procedures During the Pandemic

When an inclement weather day is decided by our school board, transportation to schools is cancelled due to unsafe road conditions. Due to staffing shortages within our system, YRDSB has determined that schools will be closed on Inclement Weather days as appropriate supervision cannot be maintained with current public health restrictions in the building. In these instances, families are notified the morning of and learning will take place remotely.

- All elementary and secondary schools will be closed to students
- Office staff will mark all students using the attendance code of BC (Bad Weather / Bus Cancellation. Edsby and Trillium Quick Tips.
- Before and After (B&A) Care programs will **not** run.
- Child Care Centres may remain open at the discretion of the operator

In the event of a school closure, this information will be communicated to local media outlets, the Student Transportation Services website, School Transportation Hotline: 1-877-330-3001, the Board's website and Twitter account and on the Board and school's voicemail recording.

- Make sure you have alternate child care arrangements planned for IW days (e.g. – a heavy snowstorm) when schools are closed to students.

It has been almost two years since the pandemic was declared and schools closed to students for the first time. With winter well underway, I want to remind families that this year [schools will close when an inclement weather day is declared](#). This is as a result of the pandemic and the importance of adhering to public health guidelines.

There is much to look forward to in the months ahead.

This month, students in Grades 5 to 11 will have an opportunity to vote for the students who will represent their voices next school year, during the **student trustee elections**. Student trustees play an important role in our system, including participating in board and committee meeting discussions. Throughout February, we recognize **Black History Month**. In closing, I want to acknowledge that as an education community, although we have faced many challenges and changes in the past few years, we have also seen our community come together in many ways to support our students and one another. I am proud to be part of this community and I want to thank our students, families and staff for the effort and care they have demonstrated.
