Our staff at Silver Pines PS are inviting students and families to participate in Walking Wednesdays and Winter Walk Month by walking to school with them.



## Lunar New Year – February 10<sup>th</sup>




To help deepen our understanding, and to honour YRDSB's Diamond Days, please see this <u>Lunar New Year video</u>.

Lunar New Year is a significant and meaningful cultural celebration for many people of East and Southeast Asian heritage including but not limited to Chinese, Korean, Taiwanese, Vietnamese and Indonesian communities. It is celebrated across the Asia-Pacific and diaspora communities around the world. This holiday commemorates the first day of the Lunar Calendar. The date is determined by the appearance of the moon and usually takes place between late January to early February. The official names of the new year may differ depending on the country, such as Tết Nguyên Đán in Vietnam or Tahun Baru Cina in Malaysia. For some, this occasion has religious significance as well.
