SILVER PINES IS A NUT SAFE SCHOOL

We would like to remind you that **Silver Pines Public School is a Nut Safe School.**

Please note that students are not permitted to bring food that contains any nut products. In addition, food items are never to be shared at school. Please check the ingredients carefully before sending food to school.

Please remember that several of our children will experience anaphylactic shock if they are exposed to even a tiny amount of peanut oil or peanut butter. In fact, some children will go into anaphylactic shock if they even smell peanuts or peanut products. When this happens, the child must be immediately injected with an epi-pen and then transported to the hospital for emergency treatment. If treatment is not given immediately, the results can be fatal.

For this reason the school **MUST be a PEANUT AND NUT-SAFE ZONE.** What this means is that no peanut or peanut products of any kind may be brought into the school. We are asking for your assistance in dealing with

these children's allergies. Talking about the situation with your children will also help, since the more information they have, the better they will understand the reality of the risk to those children with peanut allergies.

CLASS PLACEMENT FOR 2024/2025

In the upcoming months, our teaching staff will begin organizing classes for the next academic year. A great deal of time, consideration and staff collaboration goes into placing students in balanced and positive learning environments.

PARENT REQUESTS FOR CLASS PLACEMENT

A number of additional considerations are included in our decision making when creating classes. Regrettably, we are unable to accept specific teacher requests. Rather than suggesting a teacher, please indicate the learning style or classroom structure which would be most appropriate for your child. When teachers get together to create new class lists, we will use this information to help make our final decisions. CELL PHONES AT SCHOOL

A reminder about the use of cell phones in school. Cell phones and other personal communication devices are to be turned off and kept out of sight during instructional time, unless otherwise permitted by the teacher for instructional purposes. Cell phones are not allowed outside at recess, lunch or anytime in hallways or washrooms. If students need to contact parents, they are expected to do so through the office with the permission of their teacher. Students should not be texting at school, taking photos of any kind, or going on social media. Failure to abide by this may result in confiscation of the electronic device. Please speak to your child about this at home and help us keep our school safe. Should you need to contact your child during the school day, please call the office.

END OF DAY - EARLY PICK UP

Though we encourage families to make appointments and other engagements outside of our school hours, we understand that sometimes this is not possible. To limit disruptions to end of day routines in classrooms, we ask that any early pick-ups to be **completed by 2:30pm**. The last 30min of the school day is a busy time for students and staff who are engaged in many end of day activities, and we would like to limit any additional disruptions to the learning of all of our students during this time.
