Safe STUDENT PICK-UP and DROP-OFF PROCEDURES – Gentle reminder

A "Kiss 'N Ride" loop for parents is found on the west side of the school; the parking spaces in the "Kiss 'N Ride" loop are for parents and visitors.

On the north side of the school, is also the "Bus Loop" for school buses and taxies. Parents are asked not to use the designated bus loop lane for student pick-up, drop-off or for parking. The parking spaces in the staff parking lot are reserved for staff.

The south end parking spaces are for daycare use only.

If possible, we strongly encourage you to walk your child to and from school or have your child walk in a group / on their own as you see fit. If you must drive your child to/ from school, for the <u>safety of all</u>, we are asking drivers to adhere to these simple rules for drop-off and pick-up:

☑ DROP OFF: Before 8:30 AM, please follow the "Kiss 'N Ride" loop, have your child ready to INDEPENDENTLY exit the car, drop your child off and proceed around the loop and back onto Stave Cres. Only drop off your child in the open lane closest to the curb. The other lane is not to be used for drop off

☑ <u>Do not double park</u> or stop longer than necessary in the "Kiss 'N Ride" loop, as it makes it impossible for other cars to pass by and safely drop-off passengers.

Be respectful of community members crossing, and the directives of staff, wearing reflective vests, standing on curbs supervising flow of traffic and the safe arrival/departure of students.

☑ **PICK UP:** The Kiss 'N Ride loop can be used for student pick up. However, you will have to <u>park your car in a designated parking area or circle around the loop a few times until you see your child ready for pick up.</u>

☑ <u>Do not make a three-point turn</u> in front of school entrances. or anywhere in the school's "Kiss'N Ride" loop.

Information for Kindergarten Parents:

☑ Drop Off: Parents/Caregivers need to <u>park their car</u> and <u>walk their child to the kindergarten fenced play</u> <u>area</u> at the back of the school. Supervision at the play area will begin at 8:15 a.m.

☑ Pick Up: Please pick up your child from the kindergarten fenced play area at the <u>side of the school</u>. Children will be released to designated adults only.

IMPORTANT REMINDER - FOOD POLICY @ SILVER PINES P.S.

School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Since some busing schedules begin by 7:00 a.m., cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to allow time to communicate this message to bus drivers. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all
 municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional
 educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large
 attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to
 cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements
 to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If
 buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon.
 Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same
 transportation home.



About the Program

The Evoke Study Space program is designed to help students develop effective routines, complete homework and assignments on time, stay organized and on top of their work, plan ahead, lower feelings of anxiety, and become confident, active learners. Students learn to take on more responsibility for their learning and become more self-directed.

Skills

The program offers homework and assignment checks, assistance with creating daily and weekly plans for long-term projects, and guidance for allocating study time. Active study skills for tests and exams are outlined and taught. Academic Mentors help students prioritize and adjust their study schedule as necessary, work with them to address challenges as they arise, and show students how to break down assignments into manageable chunks with due dates. Students also receive support in organizing their materials, binders, book bags, backpacks, notes and handouts.

Structure

Mentors provide guidance, encouragement, and explanations as needed to help students complete their work and assignments. Snacks are provided or students may bring their own.

(NOTE: An additional Study Space program will take place in Evoke's Aurora office.)
