1.	Principal's Report	Due to time constrains, Mrs. Yeates and Mr. Innes will talk about modern learning next meeting.		
2.	Fund Requests	 Kindergarten teachers, Ms. Haber and Ms. Warren Lee, presented the idea of "Early Years Outdoor Learning Spaces" for kindergarten to grade-3 kids. Modern Learning is not only about utilizing new technology, but also expanding classroom to outside and encouraging exploration and observations through outdoor plays. Requested funding for Outlast wooden building blocks, estimate \$3599~5899; magnetic board at \$1709, mud kitchen around \$1039~1149; giant Octoplay \$150; tarmac painting. Another Request is \$600 for a settlers of Catan Board game. Total cost around \$12000, looking for help from council to share the cost with school. Approved \$5000 for Kindergarten outdoor play, and \$300 for Settlers for Catan. Mrs. Lucas showcased how technology is utilized in school and presented cost-sharing program. This year school board will match up to \$6250 at 1:1 ratio if school can get funding elsewhere. The application for Cost Sharing program is November 30th. If council could donate \$6250, school will use the \$12500 to purchase about 40 Chromebooks (\$293.50 each) to replace current old dell laptops used in classrooms.
