Committees Updates	- The plan for Fund Raising Committee will be postponed due to the new policy that council fund raising initiatives need to tie with School Improvement Plan, which was deferred to December.  - Annie updated on QSP event, which has made about \$1,690.74 profit; will need to pay \$39 key chain cost.  - Michael gave updates on behalf of Education Committee:  - Will host a Parent Night, bringing a member of "Community Outreach Team" in local police station to talk about community safety and crime prevention.
