Administrator's Message

From May 1 to May 31, 2017, all parents/guardians of students in grades K to 12 were invited to participate in the YRDSB School Climate Survey for Parents/ Guardians. Results from this survey are used to inform Board and school improvement planning to support student achievement and well-being, and create more equitable and inclusive school environments.

The HIGHLIGHTS from the School Climate Survey for Parents/Guardians ~ Modern Learning section are below here for your reference and reflection -

Wondering what "MODERN LEARNING" is?

MODERN LEARNING I talk to my child about using social media safely. 89% 95% My child is interested in what he/she is learning at school. 88% 85% Elementary Secondary The instruction my child receives is relevant and has real life connections. 83% 75% This school keeps me well informed about what my child is learning. 71% 72%

In education today, in the YRDSB, MODERN LEARNING is defined as authentic, relevant, deep learning that enables learners to create, to connect, to communicate, to share their learning with the world to be future ready.

As your SJAM staff we are working together to provide authentic, relevant and deep learning activities for all of our students. Our goal is to engage our students and guide learning that allows all students (K-8) to create, connect, communicate and share their learning with the world and to be future ready. Ask your child(ren) at home what they are learning — and how they are learning. Students at all levels should be able to tell you the answers to these 2 questions. Our staff work together to create classroom activities that are built within a safe and collaborative culture of curiosity and risk-taking — with a focus on having a growth mindset. The ultimate goal of class placement is to support and enhance the learning of all students. We welcome any input you wish to share about your child's strengths, needs, and learning styles. However, requests for specific teachers will not be considered. The responsibility for final decisions lies with administration. Please send any information you would like considered about your child's placement for next year, in writing, to Mrs. Lott no later than April 27th.

Welcome to Kindergarten Program

The Welcome to Kindergarten program is a unique experience for new JK students and parents who will be joining SJAM in September! The program creates the foundation for positive relationships between children, parents and the school community. The orientation is aimed to provide resources and the support that is necessary to make early learning activity and play a priority in the home. This will help prepare the child for a fun and successful first year in school. Throughout the evening there will be a variety of key messages communicated such as:


Me to We


