Please note that on **Wednesday**, **June 29**, **2016** an early release day will take place to allow elementary teachers and support staff to participate in activities in the afternoon of that day in support of student achievement and school planning.

Students will attend school during the morning of Wednesday, June 29, 2016 only. Students will be dismissed at 11:30 before lunch.

Classroom Organization for September 2016

Sir Wilfrid Laurier Public School's projected enrolment for the 2016 - 17 school year is approximately 770 students. The staff allotment is close over 50, which includes all teaching staff and two full time administrators, three school secretaries and four caretakers. No Grade One classes will be housed at Sir Wilfrid Laurier PS. Grade One students attending Sir John A Macdonald PS will attend Sir Wilfrid Laurier PS for Grade Two in September 2017.

While the staffing process is not complete, Sir Wilfrid Laurier P.S. is projecting the following <u>tentative</u> school organization of 32 home room classes:

Non Homeroom Assignments: Prep Coverage; Teacher Librarian; Technology Lead Teacher; Literacy Teacher; Numeracy Teacher; Special Education and Resource Teacher (SERT); English Language Arts; Instrumental Music. Please note that the class sizes for Grades 2 and 3 classes are 20:1, the Junior Division classes 25:1 and the Intermediate Division classes 27:1 on average <u>across the system</u>. As new students continue to register or move out of the area, a new school organization may need to be considered for September. We will continue to keep you informed.

<u>Re: Student Busing Eligibility</u>

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

Bussing Information

Class Placements 2016-2017: Parent Input by May 5

Procedures for parental input into class placements were previously outlined in the March/April 2015 Laurier Link newsletter. During the months of May and June, class organization for the following year will begin. Our main objective is to create classes which will provide the optimum learning environment for everyone. Student placement is based on considerations such as a child's capabilities, gender, work habits, social skills, and behaviour.

Our teachers have the benefit of knowing the children with whom they are currently working, and recognize their students' learning styles. The teachers' professional decisions are both respected and relied upon. We appreciate that parents have valuable information to share with us too. If you have suggestions or input which will be shared with and help staff make an appropriate grade placement, please write a note to Mme Finn **before Thursday, May 5.** Rather than requesting a particular teacher, please indicate the learning style or classroom structure which would be most appropriate for your child. When teachers meet to create new class lists, this information will be considered. Requests will only be accommodated where placement will enhance student learning. The decision regarding class placements remains with the School Principal.

First Day Entry Procedures: Class Lists 2016

Class lists for Sir Wilfrid Laurier Public School will <u>not</u> be posted outside the main office during the last week of August again this year as is the case with all York Region DSB schools. On the first day of school, students in Grade 2 are to go to the gym; students from Grades 3 to 8 are to proceed to the back of the school where they will be met by the teachers by grade who will have class lists and a large sign identifying the grade level. Should it rain on the first day of school, this will occur inside the school with directions posted on the doors.

First Day Dismissal Procedures

Any parents who know of a change in their child's before and/or after school child care arrangements for next September are asked to please send a note to the School Office and c.c. their child's teacher before September 2. It is important that the office know to whom children are to be released on the first day of school. A form has been provided to parents of Grade 1 students currently at SJAM for this purpose for the 2016-2017 school year. Parents are asked to check <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u> for busing arrangements mid to late August for the 2016-2017 as changes will be made to existing routes.

SWL Track and Field

Our SWL Track and Field Day for Grades 4 to 8 takes place on Tuesday, May 17th (raindate May 20). On this day, our students will participate in numerous activities, such as races, high, running, long and standing jump. It is a fun-filled day in preparation for our Area and Regional Track and Field Tournaments.

Text and Library Books

In June, teachers will be collecting text books and library books loaned to students. All students are responsible for the good care of school materials and are expected to return, replace, or reimburse the school for their value should they be lost or defaced. Please check your home for any materials that belong to the school and return them promptly. Library books are due by Friday, June 10, 2016. Our preference is to have all books returned in good shape rather than collect money for their replacement. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Hot Weather Action Plan (from YRDSB Guidelines for Heat Stress & Hot Weather)

With the anticipation of warmer, even hot weather, the following steps have been reviewed with staff to help staff recognize signs of heat related illness, to avoid heat related illness for students, –

- Outdoor physical activities will be rescheduled to cooler times of the day or on another day. Shady areas in the school yard will be used, where availale.

- Blinds, curtains will be kept closed in classrooms; lights will be dimmed in the classrooms and hallways

- Board approved fans will be used to create air movement in the room; some classes may need to be relocated to cooler areas such as the gym or library to provide relief

- Students are advised to wear loose light clothing, which will help to reduce body heat through moisture evaporation

Students are encouraged to drink water for re-hydration after excessive fluid loss during physical activities or on hot, humid days; avoid using carbonated drinks with caffeine (most soft drinks) as they promote fluid loss
Teachers will look for opportunities to use classrooms on the first level – available for use due to field trips or through the library or gym schedule.

Celebrating Multiculturalism

The following events may be celebrated by students at Sir Wilfrid Laurier in May and June: **BAHA'I FAITH:**

May 23: Declaration of the Bab. On May 23, 1844 C.E., a man known as the Bab (which means 'the Gate') announced his mission as a manifestation of God and whose purpose was to prepare the world for the coming of the promised manifestation of all religions, Bahu'u'llah. The Baha'i calendar is dated from this day. Work and academic studies are suspended on this day.

May 29: Ascension of the Baha'i. This date marks the passing in 1892 C.E. of Bahu'u'llah, the prophet-founder of the Baha'i Faith, near Haifa. Work and academic studies are suspended on this day. **BUDDHISM**:

May 15: Wesak is the most auspicious day of the year, celebrating Buddha's Birth, Enlightenment, and Final Demise. In Canada, Buddhist groups join together to celebrate these festivals as one. This is done on the day of the fourth full moon after the lunar new year, or the Sunday closest to that day, usually mid-May.

ISLAM: May 5: **Miraj-un-Nabi** commemorates Prophet Muhammad's (pbuh) famours night journey (al-Isra) from Mecca to Jerusalem and his subsequent ascenstion (al-Miraj) to paradise.

May 23: **Nisfu-Shaban** is known as the Night of Forgiveness or repentance. Many Muslims spend the preceding night in prayer seeking God's guidance.

June 6: **Ramadhan** is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. All Muslims who are physically able, fast during this month abstaining from food and drink each day from dawn to sunset.

The beginning of Ramadhan depends on the sighting of the moon on the previous evening.

JUDAISM: June 12-13: Shavuot celebrates the Israelites receiving the Torah.

<u>WICCA</u>: May 1: **Beltane** meaning "May", the greening of the Earth, blossom time, when Goddess and God are reunited. Beltane has long been celebrated with feasts and rituals.

CHRISTIANITY:

May1: Easter Sunday in the Orthodox churches. The church calendar year begins with Pascha (Eastern calendar).

May 5: Ascension Day (Western) marks Jesus' ascension into heaven and is observed through prayers and music. It occurs forty days after Easter.

May 15: **Pentecost** celebrates the renewal of faith that Jesus' followers felt after his death. It commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples of Jesus. It comes 50 days after Easter.

ISLAM: May 5: **Miraj-un-Nabi** commemorates Prophet Muhammad's (pbuh) famous night journey (al-isra) from Mecca to Jerusalem and his subsequent ascension (al-mi'rai) to paradise.

JUDAISM: June 12-13: Shavnot celebrates the Israelites receiving the Torah.

NATIONAL ABORIGINAL DAY: June 21. A day declared by the Assembly of First Nations. First Nations' organizations cease work during this day where all Canadians can celebrate the contributions Aboriginal people have made to Canada. This day was chosen because it also is the summer solstice. For generations, many Aboriginal people have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day. <u>SIKHISM</u>: June 16: **Martyrdom of Garu Arjan Dev Ji.** The fifth Guru(1563 -1600 C.E.), who built the Temple of God in Amristar, was martyred on this day.

<u>ZOROASTRIANISM</u>: June 29 – July 3. Ghambar Maidyoshem celebrates the creation of water, the sowing of the summer crop and the harvesting of grain.
