Inclement Weather — School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- a decision to cancel school bus service will be **region-wide** meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- school bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- when bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.

Please call the school attendance line if your child will stay home due to a bus cancellation. The number is 905-927-1452, press 1. In your message, please include your child's first and last name, grade, teacher and the reason for the absence. Thank you for your assistance!

Student Drop off and Pick up

When dropping off your child after the 8:30am morning bell, please bring your child to the office for an admit slip. This will allow office staff to update attendance records.

When picking up your child, please ensure the teacher and student are aware. Writing early pickups in the agenda is very helpful for the teacher and student so they are prepared at pickup time. This will help decrease the amount of interruptions to the class when the office calls for the student. We encourage students to remain in their classrooms for the instructional time.

Milk Program

Vulnerable Sector Screening — YRP

Volunteers assume an important role within a school. A requirement of York Region District School Board is to assist in ensuring a safe environment for students and staff is the completion of a **Voluntary Sector Screening** (VSS) and the signing of **Confidentiality Agreement**. If you wish to volunteer in the school or on a field trip, please ensure you have a VSS completed with York Regional Police. A letter will be provided by the office that is presented to York Regional Police Community Resource Centre located at 10720 Yonge Street in Richmond Hill.

If you have completed a VSS and submitted it to the school in a previous school year, an **Annual Offence Declaration Form** and **Confidentiality Agreement** are required. Please complete these forms and return them to the school. Forms are available through your child's teacher or the school office.

Safe Arrival

Our check of your child's attendance is an important part of our daily routine. In the interest of ensuring that your child's safe, we ask you to cooperate with us by following the steps below if your child is absent or is expected to be absent or late in the near future:

- If a future absence or late has been planned, please inform your child's teacher by note, please include, the date and length of time of the expected absence and the reason for the absence.
- In all other cases, please call the **school attendance line at 905-927-1452**, **press 1**, to inform the office of your child's absence or late. Clearly leave your child's first and last name, grade, their teacher's name, the reason and the duration of the absence.

If a child is not in school by the 8:30am start of school, and the school office has not received any notification from the parents, the school will take the following steps:

- Call the student's home
- If we do not reach you at home, we will call your work and/or cell phone numbers.
- If we cannot reach you at work we will call your emergency contact numbers.
- If we are not able to obtain information from your emergency contact regarding your child's whereabouts, we will speak to a sibling, if one is in the school.
- If we are not able to obtain any information, we will consider your child missing and will contact the York Regional Police.

Dress for the Weather

With the colder weather and snow upon us, please dress your child (ren) warmly and in layers. Hats, mittens, boots, and snow pants are recommended. Please label all items to prevent your child from losing them. We encourage students to bring indoor shoes.

FI registration will begin January 20, 2017. Parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2017, and wishing to enroll in the FI Program, can visit or call the school office and request an Office Index Card - short version. The Office Index Card must be signed by the principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to the designated FI program location to register between January 20 and February 10, 2017.

This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrollment information or to pre-register.

Immunizations

On Jan 27th, the Community and Health Services Department, Public Health Branch will be at Sir Wilfrid Laurier for Round 2 of vaccines for Grade 7's. It is the Meningococcal vaccine ACYW 135. These vaccines will be given at the school.



Dental Screening

Dental health contributes to our general health and well-being. Dental screening will be conducted at Sir Wilfrid Laurier by registered dental hygienists for all children in Grades JK, SK, 2, 8, possibly Grades 4, 6 and others, as required by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Program under the Ontario Public Health Standards and Protocols. Dental screening consists of a quick look into the mouth using a separate, sterilized mirror for each child.

Information has been sent home with your child. Dental Screening dates are coming soon, look out for more information.

Youth Wellness Program

The Youth Wellness Program aims to enhance knowledge, attitudes and skills regarding the promotion of mental, emotional and social well-being. We do this through providing workshops in elementary and secondary schools and communities in our regions, as well as through facilitating groups and one-to-one counselling and support.

Did you know that:

- · 1 in 3 will experience a mental health problem in their lifetime
- · 1 in 5 will experience a mental health problem this year
- · Anxiety is the #1 diagnosed mental illness amongst young people
- · Stress immobilizes young people unless they have solid coping mechanisms

The grade 7 and 8 students will be taking part in two workshops:

January 31: "Mental Health Myth Busting". This workshop challenges students to identify stigmatizing language and a game of True or False to help separate Fact from Fiction

February 8: "Tackling Stress & Anxiety – Health and Wellness Strategies for Empowered Young **People"** Because anxiety is the #1 diagnosed mental illness amongst young people it is important understand what it is, learn your stress triggers, and become aware of how to deal with them.

madd Canada Presentation

On Monday, January 16, the grade 7 and 8 students will be attending the MADD Canada School Assembly entitled "24 Heures". MADD Canada's School Assembly Program is an all Canadian production shown on a large HD screen. The School Assembly Program is an on-screen fictional re-enactment of the trauma that can result when someone makes the choice to take drugs or alcohol and get behind the wheel. The presentation also includes interviews with people who have been injured and/or lost a loved one(s) as a result of impaired driving. Innocent people are injured and killed every day. Friends and family will forever feel the pain of losing a loved one. It presents a message your child won't soon forget, all delivered with a state-of the art sound system, HD projector and screen.

The key messages are:

- Peer pressure
- Dangers of binge drinking
- Realities about impairment caused by smoking marijuana
- Mixing marijuana and alcohol
- Accepting rides from alcohol or drug impaired drivers
- Importance of planning ahead
- The real life changing consequences of one wrong decision
- Student empowerment
