Treasurers Update (Joyce A).	<ul> <li>Joyce provided a synopsis of numbers to date with a hard copy</li> <li>Based on actual lunches purchased for the four separate lunch programs (Mondays - Pita provided by Main St. Greek, Tuesdays - Dumplings provided by Asian Legend, Wednesdays - Pizza provided by Pizza Hut, Thursdays - "Fun Lunch" provided by Lunch Lady, and Fridays - Subs provided by Subway) projected profits for the first term (September 17 - January 31) are approximately \$25k</li> <li>Sorted by funds raised (most to least) are Pizza, Dumplings, Fun Lunch, Subs and then Pita</li> <li>Profits per order range from \$0.33 to \$2.47</li> <li>Costs for students were based on expenses incurred and in trying to keep costs as similar as possible with other lunches (I.e.: Cheese pizzas and dumplings are the same cost to students \$5.50 and pepperoni is only 0.50 per order more, 6" sub costs are the same as the pepperoni pizzas of \$6.00. The largest meals, 12" subs and all pitas, cost \$8 and \$8.50 each.)</li> <li>The snack program is available daily to <b>all</b> students. A bin with different snack options is in each classroom. The program is funded through applied for grants and council funds (raised through various fundraising initiatives like the weekly lunch program.)</li> </ul>
