3.1.2. THE ROLE AS DEFINED BY THE YORK REGION DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD

The policy statement for the Board's policy on school councils provides a clear sense of the role and reads as follows:

- The York Region District School Board believes that collaborative and inclusive partnerships, among schools, families and their communities, are essential to improving student learning and increasing a shared sense of accountability for public education.
- Strong partnerships are built from a common vision and common goals, nurtured through regular communication and meaningful consultation, involving all members of the school community [through engagement and inclusion].
- School councils play an important role in building school, family and community partnerships by providing input into relevant Board and school-level decisions and by encouraging the involvement of all members of the school community in support of student learning, achievement and well-being.

While the primary role of a school council is focused within the school community, the Board values advice from school councils on the development and review of policies and other matters of concern to councils.



How we will do this:

Engage in professional conversation and learning to develop inclusive, responsible and flexible learning environments and co-design the learning spaces to better meet the needs of staff, students, and learning.

If we build our knowledge of inclusive learning environments, authentic tasks, and assessment, then student wellbeing will be fostered and students will engage in the learning and assessment process, while demonstrating critical and creative thinking in a variety of ways.

Build our collective understanding of designing and assigning authentic tasks

How we will do this:

Provide multiple opportunities for grade teams and staff to be released to co-develop and/or reframe authentic tasks, analyze impact, and share back to the staff. Incorporate a variety of assessment strategies including: observations, conversations and products

How we will do this:

Continue to explore a variety of assessment strategies and ways to document the learning and share with families.

EQUITY & Inclusivity

- ★ Further develop an awareness of socio-cultural consciousness to understand how our social identities shape our mindsets and practices as educators
- ★ Understand how barriers in our learning environments (biases, practices, structures) impact our learners.
- ★ Examine approaches to planning learning that are responsive and allow for multiple entry points for our learners.
- ★ Examine our pedagogical practices to become increasingly reflective educators.


