Please ensure that your child arrives promptly and is prepared for a full day of learning. The school day ends at 3:25 p.m. Please ensure that your child is picked up promptly. We will get bus students safely onto busses and child care students safely to their after-school care locations. Students who walk are expected to go home upon dismissal.

KEEPING EVERYONE SAFE - HOW FAMILIES HELP

Families play a critical role in supporting health and safety in our school. The most important role families play to help mitigate the transmission of COVID-19 at Sixteenth Avenue is to <u>screen</u> their child daily for any COVID-19 symptoms. Parents/guardians <u>MUST</u> keep their child at home if they are sick, have ANY COVID symptoms, have members at home displaying COVID-19 symptoms, or have had close contact with anyone diagnosed with COVID-19. If one covid symptom is displayed, a COVID test will be required.

Parents/Guardians:

- <u>Screen</u> your child(ren) every day
- Wear masks and not congregate when on the school property during pick-up and drop-off
- Remain 2-meters away from members of other households and staff at all times
- Remind your child(ren) to go straight home after school
- Lunch drop-offs will not be permitted. Please ensure that you pack a snack, lunch, utensils for your child.
- Students are expected to remain at school for lunch.

KEEPING EVERYONE SAFE AT SCHOOL

- Students in Grade 1 to 8 are required to wear 3-layer masks; kindergarten students are <u>strongly</u> <u>encouraged</u> to wear masks.
- New this year: Masks are optional outdoors during recess as long as the 2-m physical distance can be maintained. Students must have access to their masks at all times.
- Students and staff perform hand hygiene throughout the day, either washing hands or using hand sanitizer.
- We follow physical distancing, i.e. remain 2-m apart, not touching others, directional and movement signage.
- Teachers will continue scheduling regular hand hygiene for their students.
- Non-scented, alcohol-based sanitizers will be available in each class and throughout the school and at designated entry and exit points.

Parents/guardians must have a plan in place to pick up their child(ren) immediately should they become ill or exhibit COVID 19 symptoms. If your child(ren) becomes unwell at school:

- The office will contact you to pick up your child immediately.
- Students will be supervised in an isolation room until a parent/guardian can pick them up.
- If we are not able to reach parent(s)/guardian(s) we will call the emergency contacts provided. Please ensure that the school has your most up-to-date contact and emergency information.

BUSSING

Students must adhere to the following rules on the bus in order to ensure safety:

- Students are asked to thoroughly wash their hands and/or use hand sanitizer prior to boarding a bus or school vehicle.
- Students <u>must wear a face mask</u> while riding the school bus.
- Students MUST sit in their assigned seats in order.

Waiting at a Bus Stop

- While waiting at bus stops, students, parents/guardians are encouraged to wear a face mask and maintain social distancing between family groupings. Social distancing of 2 metres must be maintained. Students are to arrive at their designated bus stop at least 5 minutes prior to the posted pick-up time.
- Once the bus arrives, students should line up while maintaining social distancing.
 No more than one student should access the entry stairs of the bus at a time. Students should proceed to their assigned seat as quickly as possible.

Kiss-and-Ride

- Please enter and exit via the arena parking. Please refrain from using the bus loop or entering at the traffic light. This is the route of the school busses. We want to avoid delaying the drivers and eliminate any non-school bus traffic.
- When in the arena lot, please pull up alongside the arena building and have your child(ren) exit the vehicle onto the walkway.
- Once your child exits the car, please leave the kiss and ride area immediately.

We want to thank you for your continued cooperation and support in keeping all of our children safe.
