

Grade 9 students take


- 6 compulsory courses, which include:

- 2 elective courses

When students pass the course, they earn a credit.

Additional Requirements:

- *40 Hours of Community Service (completed over the four years of high school)*
- *Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test - Normally written during Semester 1 of Grade 10.*

Graduation Requirements NEW

Online learning graduation requirement - Opting out

Parents who wish to opt out or exempt their child from the online graduation requirement must complete the opt-out form available from their child's school board. Exemption from the online learning graduation requirements may be requested by:

- the parent or guardian of the secondary student
 - students who are 18 years of age or older
 - students who are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental control

Compulsory Credits

- 4 credits in **English** (1 credit per grade)
- 1 credit in **French** as a second language
- 3 credits in **Mathematics** (at least 1 in Gr. 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in **Science**
- 1 credit in **Canadian Geography**

Compulsory Credits

- 1 credit in **Canadian History** (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in the **Arts** (Music, Visual Arts or Drama)
- 1 credit in **Health and Physical Education**
- 0.5 credit in **Civics** & 0.5 credit in **Career Studies**
- 1.0 additional credit in Group 1, Group 2, Group 3

Elective Credits

Students choose 12 from a range of subjects:

Music, Photography, Drama, Visual Arts (**The Arts**)

Economics, International Business (**Business Studies**)

Ancient Civilizations, Social Justice, Law, History (**History**)

Programming, Computer Engineering (**Computer Studies**)

In-Community Placements, Military Co-op, OYAP (**Co-Op**)

Studies in Literature, Business English, Writer's Craft (**English**)

Working with Children, Food and Nutrition, Foods (**Family Studies**)

French Language, Spanish (**Moderns**)

Fitness, Kinesiology, Intensive Volleyball (**Health & Phys Ed**)

Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth Sciences (**Science**)

Construction, Engineering, Cosmetology, Hospitality (**Technology**)

Community Involvement

- A diploma requirement
 - Encourages civic responsibility, promotes community values and reinforces importance of volunteerism
 - Complete 40 hours before graduation
 - Can start in summer of grade 8
 - Should obtain approval before starting involvement
 - Student responsibility to keep record of activities
 - Guidelines and forms will be provided to help track community involvement

SHSM Program




In SHSM students in grade 11 and 12, focus on a career path that matches their skills and interests. Students receive the SHSM seal on their diploma when they:

- **Nov 2** – Grade 8 students visited SLSS
- **Nov 24-Dec 2** - Leadership Class students have been visiting Grade 8 students at their home schools

- **September TBD** - Grade 9 Leadership Day (Off site)


Important Reminders

- SLSS is **closed** to transfers for 2023-2024. Students outside our catchment are ineligible to attend.
- If SLSS is your home school, and you apply for transfer to another school/program (Arts West at Westmount, Gifted at Thornhill, Bill Crothers) and are accepted, your child should expect to attend that program. Transfers back to SLSS, even if we are your home school, are based on available space, **beginning in the third week of September.**
