Course Requests for 2018-2019

Students can start working on their Course Requests for the 2018-2019 year and can begin submitting their course requests starting February 7

Grade 10 students are encouraged to consider registering for the Specialist High Skills Major SHSM program.

SHSM is a Ministry-approved program that allows students to focus their learning on a specific economic sector while meeting the requirements for their high school diploma and assists in their transition from secondary school to apprenticeship training, college, university or the workplace. Students work towards completing the program requirements during their Grade 11 and Grade 12 years. Grade 10 students may register for SHSM any time during their Grade 10 year. The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

The OSSLT is a requirement for students who wish to graduate with a secondary school diploma. This year the OSSLT will be written by all eligible students across the province on Tuesday, April 10, 2018. As a school, we have taken many steps to assist our students in completing the test successfully. One way that we have chosen to help of our students is by offering an After School Literacy Program to intensively target and reinforce the reading and writing skills specific to the OSSLT.

The After School Literacy Program will begin February 20, 2018 and will consist of 10 ninety-minute sessions. Sessions will run every Tuesday and Thursday for five weeks. Students will receive intensive practice with reading and writing skills and strategies. Student Registration Forms are available from the main office, guidance or Student Success Room 114.

Important Information For Students Turning 18

Under the Education Act, parents/guardians have a right to access their child's Ontario Student Record if the child is under 18.

If the student is 18 or over, the Board/school must follow the privacy provisions of the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act regarding the disclosure of personal information about the student to their parents/guardians. Students 18 or over must provide written permission by signing the Consent for Information Sharing form to allow parents/guardians to continue to access school-related information about the student. This includes academic progress, attendance and behaviour. Students can also obtain the form from the school office.

Attendance Reminder

If a student has to leave during the day, he/she needs to have a written note AND is required to sign out at the attendance office.

Important Information for Parents/Guardians Regarding Extraordinary Absences Exceeding 3 days:

Students are expected to be in full attendance every regular school day except in the case of illness or court order. Extraordinary absence may occur under certain circumstances. Parents should keep in mind that a very close relationship exists between regular daily attendance and success in school. Some families plan trips during the school year due to scheduling of vacations from work or to take advantage of low travel costs. When this occurs, students miss valuable learning which can impact on their success. Even brief absences can have a negative impact. Family trips can be a wonderful learning experience, but should be saved for school vacation time, such as March Break.

Before withdrawal for any vacation not in the school calendar:

- check with your child's teacher to find out what effect a long vacation may have on your child's progress.
- Complete the Extended Absence Form available in the main office.
- You will be responsible for the continuity of your child's learning when they are absent from school.

• Students must consult with their teacher before the planned absence in order to determine their standing in each of their courses and obtain any assignments that will come due during or immediately following the absence, if available from the teacher.

It must be noted that:

- It may not be possible for a student to learn all of the material or complete all of the work that was done in class during their absence.
- Assignments must be submitted on time to be eligible for grading. Tests missed MAY receive a mark of zero ("0")

Absences of 15 or more days require a meeting with an administrator
