Attendance Reminder

If a student has to leave during the day, he/she needs to have a written note AND is required to sign out at the attendance office.

Note to Parents Regarding Student Punctuality

Many students repeatedly arrive late for school. Research data suggests that students who are habitually late are more likely to earn lower grades or to underachieve. Among other things, they miss out on classroom routines which are important to daily lessons, and also affect the development of their learning skills and their character. Punctual and regular attendance is one way through which our young people show that they can honour their obligations. Parents can support student attendance in several ways. For example, parents may consider:

 Discussing the matter of punctuality with their child and how developing good habits now will affect their success when they are earning a living

- Modeling punctuality consistently
- Planning with their children to ensure that they are sleeping and waking at reasonable times, and that they plan travel time to get to school on time
- Packing their bags and laying out their clothes the night before school in order to get out of the house faster
- Avoiding congested zones when they drive students to school, dropping students off at a reasonable distance from the school. The resulting physical activity is also healthy
- Following up with teachers when students are consistently late.

We also wish to remind all drivers to use extra caution near the school and observe all traffic signs and speed limits. Thanks to everyone for your ongoing support of our students.

Important Information for Students Turning 18

Under the Education Act, parents/guardians have a right to access their child's Ontario Student Record if the child is under 18. If the student is 18 or over, the Board/school must follow the privacy provisions of the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act regarding the disclosure of personal information about the student to their parents/guardians.

Students 18 or over must provide written permission by signing the Consent for Information Sharing form to allow parents/guardians to continue to access school-related information about the student. This includes academic progress, attendance and behaviour. Students can obtain the form from the school office.
