#### **Immunization Information**

The Immunization of School Pupils Act (the Act), requires Public Health to collect and review immunization records to ensure each student is up to date with their immunizations. The Act also gives the medical officer of health the authority to direct school principals to suspend students whose immunization records are not up to date. In the first half of 2016, York Region Public Health is focusing on students who are 17 years of age.

On January 15, 2016, York Region Public Health began sending letters home to students age 17 years, requesting that they update their immunization information. 

### **Aquatic Leadership Program – Part 2**

Be certified as a lifeguard ready for employment



#### **Program Information:**

The Aquatic Leadership Program – Part 2 is offered in partnership between the York Region District School Board, Continuing Education and the City of Markham. The program uses a blended learning format consisting of pool instruction, face-to-face instruction in class and on-line learning. Upon completion, successful students may earn the following courses and certifications:

- Secondary School Grade 11 Credit Healthy Living and Aquatic Activities PAQ301
- National Lifeguarding Certification (Lifesaving Society)
- Swim, Emergency First Aid and Lifesaving Instructor (Lifesaving Society)

An examiner from the Lifesaving Society will evaluate the final aquatic skills examinations for the lifeguarding and swim and lifesaving instructor certifications. Students must pass the final exam for each aquatic course including the in-water examinations in order to receive their lifeguarding and swim and lifesaving instructor qualifications. Credits and certifications may be granted independently.

For specific details about the Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross, Standard First Aid, Lifesaving Instructors, Swim Instructors and National Lifeguard Qualifications, visit the <u>City of Markham</u> or the <u>Lifesaving Society</u> website.

#### **Dates:** February 16, 2016 to June 14, 2016

- Pool instruction and face-to-face instruction will occur on specifically scheduled Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5:00 p.m. 8:00 p.m. at the Milliken Mills Community Centre.
- There will be three Saturday classes from 9:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m. on March 5<sup>th</sup>, May 7<sup>th</sup> and June 4<sup>th</sup>
- The remaining curriculum expectations will be delivered through on-line learning when face-to-face instruction is not required.

**Minimum Requirements:** Participants must be 16 years or older by June 14, 2016, hold Bronze Cross or equivalent qualifications and Standard First Aid.

#### Cost: \$200 includes all course materials and training manuals.

All Aquatic Leadership Courses through the City of Markham recommend 100% attendance. Late admission cannot be granted. For this reason, cancellation requests must be submitted a minimum of five business days prior to the start of the first class in order to receive a refund. No refund will be issued for late requests.
