Guidance Message

Course selection for the 2019-2020 school year is currently underway. Students will be using **myBlueprint**, which is our new course selection tool. Students can log in by accessing <u>www.yrdsb.ca</u> and clicking on the **"My Pathway Planner"** icon. The final deadline for submission is **Friday February 22**. Once students submit their courses, they must print off the parent/guardian sign-off sheet, have it signed and bring it to their second semester homeroom teacher.

Immunization

Attendance Reminder

Please call/e-mail the school to let us know if your child is or will be absent, whether it is for the entire day or for part of the school day.

Signing in/out

If a student must leave during the day for any reason, he/she must sign out at the attendance office with parent/guardian permission. Parents/Guardians are asked to call or visit the attendance office to signout a student during the school day. Please do no call/text your child during class time asking them to leave class. The teacher will only allow students to leave class if they receive a call from the attendance office. Without parental/guardian consent, the student will be required to remain in school Upon return from their appointment, students must sign in at the attendance office.

Important Information for Parents/Guardians Regarding Extraordinary Absences Exceeding 3 days

Students are expected to be in full attendance every regular school day except in the case of illness or court order. Extraordinary absence may occur under certain circumstances. Parents should keep in mind that a very close relationship exists between regular daily attendance and success in school. Some families plan trips during the school year due to scheduling of vacations from work or to take advantage of low travel costs. When this occurs, students miss valuable learning which can impact on their success. Even brief absences can have a negative impact. Family trips can be a wonderful learning experience, but should be saved for school vacation time, such as March Break. Before withdrawal for any vacation not in the school calendar:

• check with your child's teacher to find out what effect a long vacation may have on your child's progress.

- Complete the Extended Absence Form available in the main office.
- You will be responsible for the continuity of your child's learning when they are absent from school.
- Students must consult with their teacher before the planned absence in order to determine their standing in each of their courses and obtain any assignments that will come due during or immediately following the absence, if available from the teacher. It must be noted that:
- It may not be possible for a student to learn all of the material or complete all of the work that was done in class during their absence.
- Assignments must be submitted on time to be eligible for grading. Tests missed MAY receive a mark of zero ("0") Absences of 15 or more days require a meeting with an administrator
