Every Student Counts Survey

YRDSB's first Every Student Counts Survey (ESCS), was implemented in November, 2018. As part of a four-year cycle to monitor trends, including improvements over time, the Board is going to implement the second iteration of the ESCS during the 2022-2023 school year in order to better understand the demographic composition of our students and their experiences inside of school. The Board will use this data to:

- Identify and eliminate systemic barriers to student success;
- Create more equitable and inclusive school environments; and
- Improve student achievement and well-being.

All YRDSB students from Kindergarten through Grade 12 will be invited to participate in the ESCS during April - May 2023. This survey is voluntary and confidential and will take 20 minutes to complete. Families of students in Kindergarten to Grade 3 will complete the survey with their child at home, and students in Grades 4 to 12 will complete the survey during class time.

Celebrating Neurodiversity

Dear Families,

In this edition we will focus on celebrating neurodiversity within our student population. We recognize Autism Acceptance day through highlighting strengths, characteristics, resources, and celebrating the spectrum; we want to acknowledge that families are the core support. There are many ways of thinking, learning or acting and we know that the uniqueness between us as people is to be celebrated and acknowledged. This year, we are moving to increasing acceptance.



For families who are looking to increase their understanding in supporting Autistic people, Kerry's place offers a great Resource Portal where there are videos and handouts with helpful information to expand understanding of Autism. Kinark Autism Services has created a spring guide for services available from April to June 2023 for families connected to the Ontario Autism Program for free. They also have free Parent & Caregiver Education that is available to all families.

<u>Autism Ontario</u> provides informational resources about the intersection between Mental health and Autism. They share how Autistic youth who also experience <u>Anxiety</u> may find sensory support or art therapy helpful. Sensory calming



techniques may include a fidget object, or making sure to have noise cancelling headphones accessible. Art therapy can help many people share feelings in a creative way- this can look like painting or picking up a musical instrument!

It is important to acknowledge the diversity in experience and characteristics of Autistic youth, and learn alongside while solving problems, coping with challenges and expressing joy. When we talk about Autistic youth, it is important to note the identity first language used as this is preferred by most Autistic people. We do encourage people to check in with each person to see what language fits best for them.

Kindergarten Registration 2023-2024



Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration for September 2023 begins Friday, January 20 from 8:30 am for the 2023-2024 school year. Children who turn four or five years old during 2023, live within the school boundary and whose parents/guardians are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for Kindergarten.

There are several ways you can register for Kindergarten:

- **Online** Families can access the online Kindergarten registration information at www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten. It is recommended that families use a laptop or a desktop, rather than a mobile device to complete this registration.
- **By email** Families can download the <u>Elementary School Registration Form</u> at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten</u> and email the completed form to their school email address. Email addresses can be found on the <u>school website</u>.
- **By phone** Families can request support from the school Principal/Vice-Principal to complete the registration form on their behalf by collecting the required information by phone. Families can request an interpreter, if needed, during this phone conversation. Call your local school.
- **By mail or appointment**. You can mail completed applications to the school, or request an appointment to drop-off your completed paper application form. Families are asked to follow all school COVID-19 protocols while on site.

Once you have completed your application, the school will contact you to make an appointment to review and verify the <u>required documents</u>.
