A Message from the Administration

Last June, when the Board Improvement Plan was released it included 3 areas of focus for the York Region District School Board: Mathematics, Mental Health and Modern Learning. At Stonebridge we are exploring and learning more and implementing actions in all three areas. Over the past few years our focus has been to provide learning opportunities for students that promote critical thinking and give students the opportunity to communicate their thinking. This work on critical thinking aligns well with Modern Learning as well as Mathematics.

At Stonebridge Public School, we are just beginning our professional learning on effective math instruction, which will include the understanding of a Growth Mindset (a belief that you can learn math), the use of games/puzzles to support the understanding of concepts, teacher led mini-lessons (to build fluency with mental math strategies) and meaningful problem solving that are drawn from real life contexts. During our Professional Learning Day on Friday, February 3rd our staff were engaged in this learning. We learned how to use rekenreks (arithmetic racks) and dot plates to help our youngest students learn number concepts, and how our older students use meaningful problems to develop a variety of strategies that are useful to them to understand, apply and communicate their thinking in mathematics. In March, we will have a parent's evening to further explain the Comprehensive Math Program to parents and we will also have a Family Math Night to provide mathematical experiences for families. Look for a flyer coming home about these two events by the end of February. You will find more information about doing math with your children on page 5 of this newsletter.

On Thursday, February 16th, your child will bring home his/her first term report card. Please find time to discuss the report card with your child. The provincial report card gives you information about your child in two different areas: the development of learning skills and work habits, and achievement of curriculum expectations for the subject areas such as Language, Math and Science. We encourage you to review both sections of the report card with your child looking for areas of strength and areas for improvement. This is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate what your child is doing well and set goals for term 2 in the areas where improvement is needed. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's report card, please contact your child's teachers.

Kindergarten Registration 2017-2018

Kindergarten registration will commence on January 20th at 10:00am, 2017 for the 2017-2018 school year.



Registration forms are available on YRDSB's website: <u>www.yrdsb.ca</u>. Children who turn four or five years old during 2017, live within the school boundary are eligible to register for kinder-garten.

Stonebridge kindergarten information session for parents is being planned for May 25, 2017. More information will be provided at registration.

French Immersion Registration

Information sessions for the French Immersion (FI) program will take place at Sir John A. McDonald Public School, 45 Murison Drive, Markham, on January 19, 2017 at 7 p.m.

FI registration will begin January 20, 2017. In order to streamline the registration process, parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten Stonebridge students entering Grade 1 in 2017, and wishing to enroll in the FI Program, can visit or call the Stonebridge school office and request an Office Index Card - short version. The Office Index Card must be signed by Ms. Chan, our school Principal.

Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to Sir John A. McDonald Public School to register between January 20 and February 10, 2017. This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrolment information or to pre-register.

Snack Program at Stonebridge

We are beginning a snack program at Stonebridge Public School in February. We will start with a grab and go system that will be available to all students free of charge. If a student does not have a snack or is feeling extra hungry on a day, they can go to the office and get something from the bin. At first, we will be providing such snacks as apples, bananas and granola bars. All snacks will be nut free and meet the requirements of the guidelines in the Healthy Food for Healthy Schools Act.

School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all
 municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional
 educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large
 attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to
 cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.
