3:25 Dismissal We also asked our community for some feedback to see how you were doing, and what your experience has been with distance learning. We received many responses sharing how you were doing during this time, how you are supporting yourselves, each other and those that we love. Many of you expressed concerns around the academic, social and emotional welfare of your children, challenges at home and being the main support for your child/ren and their learning. There was a strong theme that we were all doing what we needed to do to stay at home to flatten the curve and that learning from a distance was not ideal because students missed the face-to-face interactions with their teachers and classmates. You also shared that getting started with the online learning platform for some students was much harder than for others. Our Kindergarten through Grade 3 students took some time to get accustomed to platforms such as Google Classroom, and parents/guardians expressed that there was a lot of support that was needed initially as our Kindergarten program is play based and our Primary students do not normally use these online platforms as part of their learning. There was acknowledgement that our staff tried their best to make the transition as smooth as possible and were in touch on a regular basis to check in and support. We thank all of our community for the support you have provided to your children and for your kind words of support for our work through this pandemic.

Message from Our Trustee

Dear families,

The past few months has been challenging in many aspect within the system and particularly in the community I serve. First and foremost, I want to applaud your perseverance and resilience demonstrated as a parent and as a community member. As a father with a child in the system, I can relate to each and every single one of you how much we have contributed together thus far. I hope that you and your loved ones are keeping well and are healthy.

As a Board of Trustees, we know that our families have experienced this pandemic and the school closures in different ways, and I want you to know that my thoughts have been with you all.

With your voices and inputs, PPEs narratives has come a long way since February to date both in a public health domain to local domain, as I brought your voice to the board. You know the most as a community. I want to thank you for both yours and the board concerting effort.

Since the extension of March Break, the school board moved quickly to introduce an equitable and comprehensive <u>Learning</u> and <u>Caring Plan</u> through an intentionally phased approach. Our plan focused on both supporting student well-being and providing continuation of learning for more than 127,000 students. A plan was developed that respected each family's unique situations and focused on maintaining a caring, safe and inclusive learning environment. To support this, over 20,000 pieces of technology were distributed to ensure that all of our students could access the learning opportunities available to them, and resources and plans were put in place to support all of our learners, including students with special education needs and English language learners.

We are all part of a larger community and I am inspired to see the many different ways schools, families and students maintained their connections with one another. It was also moving to see the many inspiring ways our school board, students, staff and families acknowledged our frontline workers and made contributions to the fight against COVID-19. As a school board, for example, we donated over 145,000 pieces of personal protective equipment, including gloves, masks and more. Also, we have both students and teachers taking an initiating and innovative role in combating COVID-19

Each and every one of us has made a difference - in staying home as much as possible and following <u>public health guidelines</u>. I know that this has meant making sacrifices.

To our graduating class of 2020, I know this is not the graduating year you had hoped for. I appreciate that the school closures will not affect your ability to graduate, however this unique situation and the need to postpone graduations has been disappointing. I remain tremendously proud of all of our graduates and look forward to celebrating this important milestone with you as soon as we are able to reschedule the graduation ceremonies.

In addition, I know that you have missed out on field trips, awards events, athletic banquets, spirit days, assemblies, our annual <u>Celebrating Student Success awards</u> and the many other ways we extend learning, connect as a community and celebrate the achievements of our students.

We have also been unable to gather together as we normally would in our schools and communities to celebrate or recognize important dates, including Sikh Heritage Month, Pesach, Good Friday, Easter (Western), Vaisakhi, Holy Friday, Orthodox Easter (Eastern), Ridvan, Jewish Heritage Month, Asian/South Asian Heritage Month, Ramadan, Pride, National Indigenous History Month, Italian Heritage Month and Portuguese Heritage Month. As a Board, these dates of significance are important for us to acknowledge and we will continue to celebrate and value the wealth of diversity in our community.

While this learn-at-home experience is unprecedented to all of our students, I trust and believe that this undesired but necessary extended school closure is prudent and best to our community, for the safety and well-being for the students we serve.

As the school year comes to a close, I want to wish you and your families a safe, healthy and happy summer. I look forward to a time when we can welcome your children back into our schools again. We know that families have questions about what the return to school will look like. We will continue to share information with you as it becomes available. In the meantime, we encourage you to continue following public health guidelines and to stay connected.

Summer Institute Programs Cancelled

To help reduce the spread of COVID-19, York Region District School Board is cancelling Summer Institute programming this summer. This is in line with public health guidelines. Summer Institute was scheduled to run July 6 - August 14.

Families who are already registered for the program are being notified and full refunds will be processed for families who have paid. Processing refunds may take some time and we are asking families to be patient.

Staff who were scheduled to work at Summer Institutes will no longer be required. If you have questions, please reach out to your Regional Coordinator.

This applies to Summer Institute only. Other summer programs, such as summer school, will be proceeding where possible within an online environment. More information will be provided in the coming weeks about these programs.

School Closed Until End of School Year (School grounds remain closed)

By order of the Minister of Education, all publicly funded schools in Ontario will be closed until the end of this school year to interrupt the spread of COVID-19. Transportation services, continuing education, permit activities, before and after care programs and daycare are also closed. **All school site amenities, including outdoor fields and play structures are closed to the public until further notice.**

National Indigenous Peoples Day, June 21st

June 21 is National Indigenous Peoples Day. This is a day for all Canadians to recognize and celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures and outstanding contributions of <u>First Nations</u>, <u>Inuit</u> and <u>Métis</u> peoples. The Canadian Constitution recognizes these three groups as Aboriginal peoples, also known as Indigenous peoples.

Although these groups share many similarities, they each have their own distinct heritage, language, cultural practices and spiritual beliefs.

In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many <u>Indigenous peoples and communities</u> have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.

Pride Month

June is Pride Month around the globe. This month was chosen to commemorate the Stonewall Riots which took place in New York City at the end of June, 1969.

The Pride Flag is internationally recognized as a symbol of pride, hope and diversity. In 1978, Gilbert Baker, a San Francisco artist, designed the Pride Flag as a response to the need for a symbol to support the LGBT rights movement. The current flag has six stripes, each with its own meaning:



To recognize Pride Month in YRDSB and our commitment to inclusive learning spaces, we are raising the flag to build understanding of the history and significance of this celebration.


