Message from Our Trustee

Dear families,

It is hard to sum up this past school year; it truly has been a year like no other. Many of our students have been transitioning between virtual and in-person learning. Others have spent the full year learning virtually as part of our Elementary and Secondary Virtual Schools. Whatever option you have chosen, this year has been challenging and has asked a lot of all of us - students, families, staff members and community partners. We have had to be flexible and adaptable in how we learn, teach and work. We have had to be diligent in learning new routines and adhering to public health measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19. And, we have had to pay more attention than ever to supporting mental health and well-being during this challenging time.

This pandemic has affected different families in different ways, and I want to thank you for your patience, support and resiliency throughout this challenging year. I also want to take this opportunity to remind you that resources are available on the Board website, including <u>community resources</u>, <u>mental health supports</u>, <u>tips</u> and <u>resources</u> to support online learning, and <u>tips for speaking with your child about COVID-19</u>. These resources will continue to be available throughout the summer.

Despite the challenges this year, we have seen incredible examples of student learning and achievement. I am incredibly proud of the determination, resilience, creativity and perseverance demonstrated by our students. I want to wish a very special congratulations to the graduating class of 2021. This is an important milestone and while we are all disappointed that we are unable to celebrate in person as we would have hoped, we look forward to honouring our graduates virtually. Schools are working hard to make their virtual graduation celebrations a very special occasion. We are very proud of our graduates and wish you all the very best in the next chapter of your journey.

I also want to acknowledge the hard work of our educators and staff members who have maintained a focus on supporting students while navigating the challenges of the past year. Our staff members have shown a true commitment to their own learning in the service of our students, and have been participating in webinars, online training modules and other **professional learning opportunities** throughout the school year to enhance their own practices.

Earlier this spring, we launched the <u>Board's **Dismantling Anti-Black Racism Strategy**</u>, with the goal to "achieve racial equity in YRDSB schools for Black students and staff." The strategy was co-developed by York Region Black community leaders, YRDSB staff and in consultation with students. Thank you to everyone who supported this work and participated in the launch. We look forward to continuing this essential work.

The Board is also preparing for the 2022 Municipal Election by undertaking a **review of school board trustee electoral areas**. The boundaries of the areas the trustees represent change over time due to population growth and changes in student numbers. We are committed to ensuring that, as the region's population changes, electoral areas continue to reflect the communities we serve. Public input is important to the Board of Trustees during the electoral area review. Throughout the process there will be a number of ways for you to learn more about the review and to provide input. Information about the <u>Trustee</u> <u>Determination and Distribution</u> is available on the Board website.

As was communicated to families in May, we are looking ahead to the 2021-2022 school year. Our goal is to create a learning model within the provincial funding allocation that meets public health requirements and is centred on the safety and wellbeing of our students and staff members. To help meet this goal, we are planning to implement a hybrid model of learning for elementary and secondary schools, a model several other school boards have been using during this current school year. Through this model, families will continue to have the ability to opt for in-person or remote learning, and placement for all students will be in their home school. I know there are many questions about what this will look like and what to expect in September. The Board continues to provide as much information as possible and has shared some_frequently asked ques_tions on the Board website about the model change for 2021-2022, this page will continue to be updated. As planning continues and information becomes available, we will provide regular updates to families. Please know that health and safety of our students, staff and families remains our top priority. You can also continue to find information on the Board website at www.yrdsb.ca and on Twitter_@YRDSB.

As we go into the summer months, I want to thank you once again for your support over the past year, and to wish you all a safe, healthy and enjoyable summer.

As the school year comes to a close, I want to wish you and your families a safe, healthy and happy summer. I look forward to a time when we can welcome your children back into our schools again. We know that families have questions about what the return to school will look like. We will continue to share information with you as it becomes available. In the meantime, we encourage you to continue following public health guidelines and to stay connected.

COVID-19 Vaccines What you need to know

Vaccination is a safe and effective way to prevent disease. Vaccines save millions of lives each year.

When a large percentage of the population becomes immune to COVID-19, the spread of the virus will slow down or stop. Vaccination is our best shot for allowing individuals, families and workers to safely resume normal life.

ABOUT THE VACCINES

Only vaccines that are safe and effective are approved by Health Canada.

- · Each vaccine has been rigorously tested in a series of large-scale trials
- Vaccines are tightly regulated and closely monitored in Canada
- Health Canada will only approve a vaccine that is safe for widespread use
- COVID-19 can have serious, life-threatening complications, and if you get sick, you could spread the disease to friends, family and others around you
- People who are vaccinated gain protection without the serious potential consequences of COVID-19 infection
- You cannot get COVID-19 from the vaccines; they do not contain the virus.

COVID-19 vaccines are approved by Health Canada. Age recommendations are subject to change. Visit vork.ca/COVID19VaccineInfo for the latest updates and vaccine roll out of eligible groups

Pfizer BioNTech vaccine (approved for 12+)

mRNA vaccine, two doses

AstraZeneca/COVISHEILD vaccine (approved for 18+)

 Viral vector vaccine, two doses (first doses currently paused, effective May 11, 2021; see <u>york.ca/COVID19VaccineInfo</u> for details) Moderna vaccine (approved for 18+)

mRNA vaccine, two doses

Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) vaccine (approved for 18+)

Viral vector vaccine, one dose

Beginning about two weeks after the first dose, all COVID-19 vaccines currently approved are very effective at preventing COVID-19 infection, serious illness, hospitalization and death.

The type of vaccine you receive will depend on the storage and transportation requirements of the vaccines as well as current supply in Ontario.

The COVID-19 vaccine is free and voluntary.

HOW DO COVID-19 VACCINES WORK?

The vaccine works by teaching our bodies to build a strong immune response against the COVID-19 spike protein. Once triggered, this helps us fight infection if we are exposed to the real virus in the future.

SIDE EFFECTS

Temporary side effects of the vaccine are typically mild to moderate and may include:

- Soreness at the injection site
- Body chills
- Feeling tired or feverish





Some side effect symptoms can be part of the body's response to developing immunity. As some side effects can also be similar to symptoms of COVID-19, speak to your health care provider to determine if you need further assessment if you have any concerns. Side effects may be more common with the second dose. Serious side effects after receiving the COVID-19 vaccine are rare; however, if you develop any of the following reactions within three days of receiving the vaccine, seek medical attention right away or call 911 if you are severely unwelt:

 Hives, swelling of the face or mouth, trouble breathing, very pale colour and serious drowsiness, high fever (over 40° C), convulsions or seizures, other serious symptoms

ALLERGIES

- If you experienced a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) to an ingredient of, or previous dose of, the <u>Pfizer-BioNTech</u>, <u>Moderna</u>, <u>AstraZeneca/COVISHEILD</u> or Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) vaccine, you should not receive it
- If you experienced a less severe allergic reaction to a previous dose or a component of the Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, AstraZeneca/COVISHEILD or Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) vaccine, you must talk to your health care provider before you receive the vaccine and are required to bring a letter from your health care provider indicating the vaccine can be administered

PRECAUTIONS FOR GETTING THE VACCINE

Please <u>delay</u> vaccination if you have a fever or COVID-19 symptoms, are confirmed or suspected to have COVID-19, or have received a flu shot or other vaccine in the past 14 days

A consultation with your health care provider is required before receiving the vaccine if you:Have a weak immune system from an illness or therapy, or an autoimmune condition AND are undergoing certain treatments; in this case, you are required to bring a completed <u>Attestation Form</u> to your appointment to receive a vaccine. Treatments include:

 Stem cell therapy, Immune checkpoint inhibitors, CAR-T therapy, Chemotherapy, Monoclonal antibodies (e.g. Rituximab), Other targeted agents (e.g. CD4/6 inhibitors, PARP inhibitors etc.)

A consultation with your health care provider is recommended, but not required before receiving the vaccine if you:

- Are pregnant, could be pregnant or are breastfeeding
- Have an autoimmune condition, immunodeficiency condition or are immunosuppressed but are NOT on any of the treatments listed above, and you have received information/counselling on all of the points listed below:
 - A review of the risks and benefits of the COVID-19 vaccine, of the potential risks/consequences of a COVID-19 infection and a review of the risk of acquiring a COVID-19 infection
 - The insufficiency of evidence for the use of COVID-19 vaccines in these populations and possible decreased vaccine effectiveness in those who are immunosuppressed

CONTINUE FOLLOWING PUBLIC HEALTH SAFETY MEASURES AFTER VACCINATION

Studies are ongoing to determine the long-term protection of COVID-19 vaccines. There is still a chance you can contract COVID-19 after being vaccinated and it is currently unknown if you can transmit the virus after being immunized.

COVID-19 VACCINES For youth age 12 to 17

COVID-19 is a viral infection. Most children with COVID-19 will have either mild symptoms or no symptoms at all. Some children can get very sick and may require hospitalization.

Vaccinating children protects them from serious illness and hospitalization and reduces the spread of the virus within their household and the community. Children can spread COVID-19 to other people, even if they do not have symptoms.

When a large percentage of the population becomes immune to COVID-19, the spread of the virus will slow down or stop. Vaccination is our best shot for allowing individuals, families and workers to safely resume normal life, and for our children and youth to return to the things they love and miss

Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine Approved for Children 12 Years of Age and Older

- Health Canada has authorized the use of the Plizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine in children 12 years of age and older after clinical studies showed the vaccine was safe and effective for this age group
- The Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine was found to be 100% effective at preventing symptomatic COVID-19 illness in adolescents
- Health Canada will only approve a vaccine that is safe for widespread use

Eligibility

- · Due to manufacturer requirements from Pfizer-BioNTech, individuals must be age 12 at the time of vaccination
- The COVID-19 vaccine is free and voluntary
- Individuals 13 years of age and under require a parent or legal guardian to provide consent at the time of the vaccination. If a
 parent or legal guardian is unable to accompany their 12 and/or 13-year-old child to the appointment, they then can complete and
 sign a consent form and send it with the child to the appointment
- Parents and guardians are encouraged to speak to their child about COVID-19 vaccines including the risks and benefits of getting vaccinated
- The vaccine is safe for most youth, including those with a health condition such a diabetes or a weak immune system; it is also safe for individuals who are pregnant or breastfeeding

How the Vaccine Works

- Pfizer-BioNTech is a messenger RNA (mRNA) vaccine
- The vaccine works by teaching our cells how to make a specific protein that will trigger an immune response
 Once triggered, our body then makes antibodies which help us fight infection if we are exposed to the real
- Once orggered, our body then makes antibodies which help us light intection if we are exposed to the real virus in the future
- Two doses of the vaccine are required for the best protection
- Beginning about two weeks after the first dose, the vaccine is very effective at preventing COVID-19 infection, serious illness, hospitalization and death

You cannot get COVID-19 from the vaccine. The vaccines do not contain the virus.

Side Effects

- Side effects after vaccination are often part of the body's natural response to a vaccine
- Side effects are usually mild to moderate and temporary, only lasting for a few hours or days

Common side effects include:

- Redness, pain or swelling at the injection site
- Muscle aches
 Fever
- Headache
 - Joint pain

Feeling tired
 Chills

Nausea

As some side effects can also be like symptoms of COVID-19, speak to your health care provider to determine if you need further assessment if you have any concerns.

Allergies

- If you experienced a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) to a previous dose or component of the Pfizer-BioNTech, you should not
 receive the vaccine; detailed ingredient lists are available at <u>canada.ca/COVID19</u>
- If you experienced a less severe allergic reaction to a previous dose or a component of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, you must talk to your health care provider before you receive the vaccine; you are required to bring a letter to your appointment confirming the vaccine can be administered
- The Pfizer vaccine does not contain eggs, gelatin (pork), gluten, latex, preservatives, antibiotics, or aluminum and is safe even if you have food, drug, or environmental allergies

Delay vaccination if you have a fever or COVID-19 symptoms, are confirmed, or suspected to have COVID-19, or have received a flu shot or other vaccine in the past 14 days.

Speak with your health care provider first before receiving the vaccine if you:

- Have an autoimmune disorder undergoing certain treatments, weakened immunity due to illness or treatment; in this case, you
 will be required to complete an <u>Attestation Form</u> prior to receiving a vaccine
- A consultation with a health care provider is recommended, but not required, for those who are pregnant, could be pregnant or are breastfeeding, as well as those who have an autoimmune condition, immunodeficiency condition or are immunosuppressed but are NOT on any of the treatments listed in the <u>Attestation Form</u>







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Finding Adler: Jewish Musicians and China's Classical Music Presentation for YRDSB Parents, Guardians & Staff

This presentation highlights connections and bonds between different peoples in times of suffering through acceptance, tolerance, compassion, understanding and giving back. Humanity eventually triumphs.

In the late 1930s, Shanghai was the only major city in the world that didn't require visas or financial guarantees of Jewish refugees. During the peak of influx of refugees, over 20,000 Central European Jews fled Nazi persecution and resettled in Shanghai. One of them was Austrian violinist Ferdinand Adler. Not only did he find a safe haven in Shanghai, but he also established a successful career as the concertmaster of the Shanghai Municipal Orchestra – today's Shanghai Symphony Orchestra. He appreciated the safe haven afforded him, and was willingly giving back to the community that hosted him. Little did he know, several of the orphans he taught later became the backbone of China's National Symphony. Decades later, the son of one of Ferdinand Adler's students embarked on a journey to find out about him.

Kindergarten Registration 2021–2022



Kindergarten registration for September 2021 began on Friday, January 15 for the 2021-22 school year. Children who turn four or five years old during 2021, live within the school boundary and whose parents/guardians are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for Kindergarten.

There are several ways you can register for Kindergarten:

Online - Families can access the online Kindergarten registration information at www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten. It is recommended that families use a laptop or a desktop, rather than a mobile device to complete this registration. By email - Families can download the Elementary School Registration Form at www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten and email the completed form to their school email address. Email addresses can be found on the school website.

By phone - Families can request support from the school Principal/Vice-Principal to complete the registration form on their behalf by collecting the required information by phone. Families can request an interpreter, if needed, during this phone conversation. Call your local school.

By mail or appointment. You can mail completed applications to the school, or request an appointment to drop-off your completed paper application form. Families are asked to follow all school COVID-19 protocols while on site. All permitted visitors must wear a mask.

Please note, at this time, under our health and safety protocols, we cannot accept walk-in registrations. Once you have completed your application, the school will contact you to make an appointment to review and verify the required documents. Our Kindergarten programs are caring and welcoming where children learn through exploration, play and inquiry. You can learn more at www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten.
