# AN IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL YORK REGION FAMILIES ABOUT IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

For many families, March break is a time for travel and getting together with family and friends. Whether staying home or planning a vacation outside of Canada, York Region Public Health offers this reminder about the importance of staying up-to-date and healthy with immunizations.

## Vaccines required to attend school in Ontario

If your child needs vaccines, such as those <u>required by law to attend school in Ontario</u>, York Region Public Health provides free <u>student catch-up immunizations</u> to all eligible students in **JK** to **Grade 12** by appointment only. You may also contact your health care professional or visit a walk-in medical clinic to receive any required or recommended publicly funded vaccines.

York Region Public Health student immunization clinics offer routine childhood immunizations to protect against the following diseases: Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Polio, Meningococcal Disease, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, and Varicella (chickenpox). Also, York Region Public Health is offering immunizations against Hepatitis B, Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and Meningococcal ACYW-135 to any eligible student in Grades 7 to 12 who may have missed getting these vaccines at one of our school-based vaccine clinics.

## Vaccines for travel

Right now, measles outbreaks are occurring in many regions of the world, including the United States. In York Region, measles is less common because of high vaccination rates. Still, cases can occur after travelling outside of Canada and most of the recent measles cases in Ontario have been linked to international travel. The <a href="Public Health Agency of Canada">Public Health Agency of Canada</a> recommends that children get their second dose of the Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccine earlier than the recommended age of 4 to 6 years if they travel outside of Canada.

It is recommended that families consult with a health care professional or visit a travel health clinic at least six weeks before travelling to review their vaccination history and ensure they are up-to-date with required vaccines before travelling. Vaccine requirements and recommendations vary by country.

## Report your child's vaccination

Every time your child gets vaccinated, you need to report it to York Region Public Health to ensure your child is protected and that an accurate immunization record is maintained. Doctors do not report vaccinations to Public Health. You can report and view your child's vaccinations online. Additional information is available on our website.

We highly encourage families to send lunches with their children in the morning. If, for some reason, you need to bring your child's well-labelled lunch to school throughout the school day, please place it in the lunch cart that, following March Break, will be placed outside the front doors of the school. # Health, Screening and Absence Reporting

## **Health Reminders**

As winter is here, it is a good time to review how to <u>protect yourself from COVID-19 and other respiratory</u> illnesses.

**Screening:** Students and staff who have symptoms of illness can <u>take the COVID-19 self-assessment here</u>. Individuals can screen daily for signs of illness and stay home when sick.

## **Hand Washing**

The single most important thing you can do to control infections is to keep your hands clean and those of the children in your care. <u>Correct handwashing techniques</u> are taught and encouraged in schools.

**Essential Health and Safety Message** 

If your child is sick with Covid-19 or flu-like symptoms, you need to keep them at home until their symptoms have been improving for at least 24 hours (48 hours if they had nausea, vomiting, and/ or diarrhea) and they do not have a fever. The health and safety of our students, staff and families remain our priority, and we will continue to follow the direction and guidance of the Government of Ontario and York Region Public Health.



# **Science & Technology Fair**

## EXHIBIT GUIDELINES

Write up a short description summarizing your science fair project to help you present. Remember to talk about the theory behind your science fair project-why your project works the way it does.

- Make it as interactive and hands on as possible. For example: Ask the audience do they think something will sink or float. Then perform the experiment and let them see what happens.
- This is also an opportunity to think outside the box and build or invent an item that demonstrates scientific principles.
- Organize a list of questions you think the audience will ask you and prepare/practice answers for them
- Practice explaining your science fair project beforehand in simple terms so anyone can understand
  it. Always be positive and enthusiastic!
- If you have no idea what someone is asking, or do not know the answer to their question, it is okay to say "I do not know."

## RULES

- MOST IMPORTANT RULE . . . SAFETY FIRST!
- 2. In the interest of including different facets of science, Volcano projects are limited to grades JK to Gr-2.
- Parents are allowed to help the students. All experiments should be supervised by an adult.
- Science fair project can be done individually or in a group of maximum 3 children. Each participant needs to fill out the registration form

- Choose a topic and be sure it interests you. Talk it over with your parents and note there can be no changes after registration deadline. March 21<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- No food or drink during an experiment and always keep your work area clean.
- Wear protective goggles when doing any experiment that could lead to eye injury.
- Respect all life forms. Animals are not allowed to be used in experiments. Do not perform an
  experiment that will harm any life form.
- Always wash your hands after doing the experiment, especially if you have been handling chemicals. Dispose waste properly.
- Any project that involves animals, harmful, corrosive, or highly reactive chemicals, drugs, or explosives is NOT permitted.
- Any project that breaks school policies, provincial, or federal laws is NOT permitted.
- Use safety on the Internet! NEVER write to anyone without an adult knowing about it. Be sure to let
  an adult know about what websites you will be visiting or have them help you search.
- If there are dangerous aspects of your experiment, like using a sharp tool or experimenting with electricity, please have an adult help you or have them do the dangerous parts.

## Kindergarten Registration 2024-2025



Kindergarten registration for September 2024 has begun for the 2024-2025 school year. Children who turn four or five years old during 2024, live within the school boundary and whose parents/guardians are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for Kindergarten.

There are several ways you can register for Kindergarten:

- **Online** Families can access the online Kindergarten registration information at <a href="https://www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten">www.yrdsb.ca/kindergarten</a>. It is recommended that families use a laptop or a desktop, rather than a mobile device to complete this registration.
- **By email** Families can download the <u>Elementary School Registration Form</u> at <u>www.yrdsb.ca/Kindergarten</u> and email the completed form to their school email address. Email addresses can be found on the school website.
- **By phone** Families can request support from the school Principal/Vice-Principal to complete the registration form on their behalf by collecting the required information by phone. Families can request an interpreter, if needed, during this phone conversation. Call your local school.
- **By mail or appointment**. You can mail completed applications to the school, or request an appointment to drop-off your completed paper application form. Families are asked to follow all school COVID-19 protocols while on site.

Once you have completed your application, the school will contact you to make an appointment to review and verify the <u>required documents</u>.
