
Math Mindset

Yet" is a powerful word to build resilient, optimistic learners.

Students understand that learning is a process, which requires many different approaches and problem solving strategies.

One often hears "I'm not good at this." "I can't do it." "I don't understand this". "I'm not a math person." Whenever we hear statements like these, we need to help our children add that very important word: <u>yet.</u> "I'm not good at this...yet." "I don't understand this...yet." This is the first step to building a positive mathematical mindset. How we talk about math and think of ourselves as mathematicians is very impactful. Encourage your children to think about ways to change their words in order to encourage a positive and open mindset when they face challenges!



Stonebridge's Primary and Junior Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics

During the 2016-2017 school year, Grade 3 and 6 students from across Ontario participated in a provincial assessment of reading, writing, and mathematics. This assessment was conducted by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO), an independent agency whose mandate is to ensure greater accountability and help improve the quality of education by providing clear and timely information about student achievement in Ontario schools.
