# Administrator's Message from Mr. Oabel and Ms. Wansbrough

Dear Parents/Guardians,


Though February is a short month, much is going on in the school.

It is report card time again and this is an opportunity for you to discuss with your child the progress they have made so far this year, and set goals for Term 2. The Term 1 Reports will be going home on **February 14th** with your child. You are encouraged to stay informed by referring to teachers' news-letters, websites, twitter, blogs, student work/and tests that are sent home.

In support of our student mental health and well-being initiatives, Stonehaven ES received approval for two "**Buddy Benches**". A buddy bench is a safe place where students can go to and seek companionship during recess, it eliminates loneliness and fosters friendship on the playground. This is a great concept for students who may be new to the school, students who are working on social skills and it also serves staff as a tool to get acquainted with all students.

There is some pre-work to introduce the concept to our students. We will be holding class visits/ division assemblies to explain how the buddy benches work and the concept behind it. We are pleased that the two benches will be around the periphery of the Rock Garden at the North End of the school. Many thanks to School Council for partnering in this initiative.

Stonehaven is Growing due to the completion of the Dilman Survey and new families moving in our catchment area. Stonehaven ES is projected to grow by about another 40 students for the year 2018-2019. This will impact our staffing, number of classrooms, classroom locations and programming as our numbers increase. As it is early in the process, we will have a firmer idea of this impact on the school as our numbers and registrations continue to come in.

### Perfumes/Scents




# Volunteering at Stonehaven E.S.

At Stonehaven E.S. we are very appreciative of our volunteers. In June 2012, YRDSB developed a policy for school volunteers. In order to volunteer in a school or attend field trips, the York Region District School Board requires all volunteers to have a

<u>Police Vulnerable Sector Check (PVSC)</u> prior to commencing a volunteer position (must state YRDSB under reason for the request). This procedure will ensure the safety of all of our students.

You can complete a PVSC application form online from York Regional Police. <u>https://www.yrp.ca/en/services/Online-Police-Background-Checks.asp</u> (The reason for the request must state: York Region District School Board).





# Safe Arrival When Buses are Cancelled Due to Weather

- If your <u>child is a bus student</u> and is staying home because of bus cancellation, you do not need to call the school to report your child(ren)'s absence.
- If your <u>child is not a bus student</u>, please call the school to report your child's absence.

Our answering machine is on before and after school hours to allow you to leave a message at anytime.

# School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

- If buses are cancelled in the morning then buses are cancelled in the afternoon. Please make arrangements to pick up your child(ren) at 2:55pm.
- <u>All school Lunch programs are cancelled on Snow-Days.</u> <u>Please remember to send a lunch with your child.</u>

# Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas en compassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled. Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to trans port their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.

Parents, students and school staff are asked to access the following radio and television stations after 6:00 a.m. to receive bus cancellation information or the **yrdsb website**.

As trustees, our goals are set out in the Board <u>Multi-Year Plan</u>. In the coming months, trustees will be reviewing and updating this plan. This process will include opportunities for public input, and trustees will be out in the communities talking about this. More information will be shared about this in the spring.

Developing and reviewing the Multi-Year Plan is just one of our responsibilities as publicly elected officials. Trustee responsibilities also include hiring the Director of Education, setting <u>Board policies</u> and the <u>annual budget</u>, and communicating with the public.

This is a good time to learn more about the <u>role of trustees</u> with the next <u>municipal election</u> taking place later this year on October 22, 2018. York Region District School Board has <u>12 trustees</u>, elected by ratepayers. As a trustee, listening and communicating with families is an important part of my role. Students, families and members of the public are welcome to attend and observe any public Board, Advisory or Board Committee meetings and to share their views with us on policy and Board governance.

As we move into the second half of the year, I hope that you are seeing evidence of your child's learning and progress, and finding opportunities to get involved in their learning and the life of the school.

# Kindergarten Registration to Commence January 19, 2017

Kindergarten registration will commence on January 19, 2018 for the 2018-19 school year. Registration forms are available on YRDSB's website: <u>www.yrdsb.ca</u>. Children born in 2013 or 2014, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten. A kindergarten information session for parents is on May 23 from 5:45pm-7:00pm. For more information please visit the YRDSB website or contact your local school.



# French Immersion Registration for Students Entering Grade 1 in September

FI registration for Grade 1 students starting in September will begin January 19, 2018 at the Mazo de la Roche school office.

In order to streamline the registration process, parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2018, and wishing to enroll in the FI Program, can visit or call their child's current school office and request an Office Index Card - short version. The Office Index Card must be signed by the Principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to Mazo de la Roche to register between January 19 and February 9, 2018. This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrollment information or to pre-register.

Grade 1 French Immersion Registration for students attending the following schools will be accepted at Mazo de la Roche PS: Armitage Village PS, Bogart PS, Glen Cedar PS, J.L.R. Bell PS, Meadowbrook PS, Robert Munsch PS, Prince Charles PS, Rogers PS, Stonehaven PS, Stuart Scott PS.
