A Message From Mr. Oabel and Ms. Wansbrough

It has been a busy month of February. We began with Random Acts of Kindness that both students and staff were engaged in. Many acts were observed from giving compliments, writing sticky notes and posting them on lockers, and lending helping hands. Students also discussed these acts in the classroom and made videos on Acts of Kindness.

The intermediate girls and boys basketball teams had a great season. They played well in their tournament showing skill and sportsmanship in their games. The junior basketball teams are under way.

Given the direction that our the York Region District School is moving with the 3 "M"s – Modern Learning, Mathematics and Mental Health, we at Stonehaven ES will also be embarking on professional development that encompasses these areas of learning. During the first week of March, our staff will be incorporating the new technology and learning into a Modern Learning perspective and eventually this will benefit and enhance our students' achievements in the classroom.

We are pleased to let the community know, that we have purchased 30 chrome books for our primary classes. Students in the primary grades now have access to this new technology to enhance their learning. We are in the midst of purchasing ipads for the kindergartens.

One of the skills that we are trying to reinforce with our students is punctuality. Currently, we are experiencing an ongoing issue with many students arriving after the instructional day has begun. Parents are encouraged to support the best learning conditions for their children by ensuring that students are present and in class when the learning begins. This is a life skill we must instill in our children if we want them to practise it as adults. Having children arrive on time reduces their disruption of learning and the learning of others in the class. Arriving on-time will also reduce unnecessary interruptions for office staff as they try to ensure that attendance and safe arrival procedures are followed for the morning.



When buses are cancelled in the morning due to stormy weather, they are cancelled for the day. Students who would normally be bused, may be taken to school by



their parents; however, parents must make their own arrangements to pick up their children at the end of the day. It is important for everyone to realize that on the days in which school buses are cancelled, schools are open.

Following our Safe School Arrivals Program, the office is required to call EVERY student who has an unexplained absence from school regardless whether they are bus students or walking students. Please call the school and leave us a message regarding your child's absence. Our answering machine is on before and after school hours to allow you to leave a message at anytime. 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Parking Lot Safety

This is not an area where anyone should be parked. If you need to get out of your car, please find a parking space (in our lot or on Best Circle) and walk your child to the appropriate area. Also, PLEASE keep moving forward once you have dropped off your child/ren, and do not back up. If you have a kindergarten student to drop off please pull up to the south end of the school and we will assist your child to the Kindergarten gate.
