
Donations for Kindergarten Please

Safe Arrival When Buses are Cancelled Due to Weather

- If your <u>child is a bus student</u> and is staying home because of bus cancellation, you do not need to call the school to report your child(ren)'s absence.
- Snow Day!
- If your <u>child is not a bus student</u>, please call the school to report your child's absence.

Our answering machine is on before and after school hours to allow you to leave a message at anytime.

School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

- If buses are cancelled in the morning then buses are cancelled in the afternoon.

 Please make arrangements to pick up your child(ren) at 2:55pm.
- All school Lunch programs are cancelled on Snow-Days.

 Please remember to send a lunch with your child.

Please note the following:

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all
 municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational
 programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas en
 compassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to cancel bus service using a
 municipality or zone methodology.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
 Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to trans port their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.
