Welcome to all our new and returning families. Our caring, professional and dedicated school team has been working hard to prepare to welcome and transition your children back to school, and to help them learn our new health and safety practices.

Earlier in September, we shared information with you about the <u>supported entry plan</u>, and the dates on which your child will be attending school during the first two weeks. If you have any questions about this, please contact the school.

- Thursday, Sept 10 In-school day for grade 9s Cohort A
- Friday, Sept. 11 In-school day for grade 9s Cohort B
- Monday, Sept. 14 In-school day for ALL GRADEs Cohort A
- Tuesday, Sept. 15 In-school day for ALL GRADEs Cohort B (Cohort assignments will be forthcoming)

We have a dedicated staff with a strong commitment to student well-being and achievement, and to promoting positive, inclusive and supportive relationships with students, families, staff and community members. We are committed to supporting our students' transition back to school and to providing a learning environment where everyone feels safe, welcome and respected.

New Covid-19 Health and Safety Protocols:

Information for Students, Parents, Caregivers

As school begins we will be implementing a number of protocols/procedures to ensure everyone's safety. Please read the following carefully. Note information is subject to change.

School Entry

- On a daily basis, parents/guardians of students under 18 and students over 18 are responsible to review and adhere to the checklist from York Region Public Health.
- COVID-19 and Children factsheet from York Region Public Health
- Any student experiencing COVID-19 symptoms is required to remain home (the use of a mask is not an acceptable alternative).
- Where possible, students must maintain a physical distance at all times, as they enter, move through and exit the building.
- Students in Grades 4 to 12 will wear face coverings (non-medical masks) while in school.
- Masks are to be work in accordance with the school dress code: no inappropriate designs, symbols, signs or language permitted
- Should a student need a mask, the Main Office will provide one
- If there is a medical reason as to why a student cannot wear a mask, please connect with the school administration at:

- Do not enter the building if you have been tested and are awaiting results or have been diagnosed with Covid-19, or you have been told by Public Health to self-isolate
- Do not enter the building if you have recently returned from travel that requires a 14 day period of self-isolation

Permitted Visitors

- Until further notice, the only visitors permitted are those who have a prearranged meeting (examples: school registration, meeting with Principal or Vice Principal)
- If you are a permitted visitor, you must conduct a COVID-19 Self assessment and check in at the main office. Please ensure that you wear a mask
- Wherever possible, visitors will be provided with an information sheet ahead of time outlining school visit protocols
- Food delivery services such as Uber Eats, Skip the Dishes, Door Dash and others (including parent drop off) are not permitted.

Hand Sanitizing

- Students, staff and permitted visitors are to sanitize their hands upon entering the school. A hand sanitizing station is in the front lobby and there is hand sanitizer in classrooms
- Students are to use hand sanitizer after: entering/leaving the classroom, touching shared objects, using the washroom, sneezing, etc.
- It is **not recommended** that students bring their own sanitizer due issues around quality, fragrance, potential hazard management. Aerosol/spray type products or dispensers of alcohol-based hand sanitizers are not permitted in the school.

Entering the Main Office

• Students and permitted visitors are to wait in the hall to be called into the office. Floor decals will be spaced to indicate proper waiting areas.

Movement within the school

- Signage will be installed throughout the school to minimize close contact with others
- Hallways and stairwells will be divided into 2-way paths
- Directional floor decals for stairwells and hallways will be visible to manage flow

Lunch

- The Cafeteria will be closed and there will be no food purchases available in the servery
- Food delivery services such as Uber Eats, Skip the Dishes, Door Dash and others as well as parent drop off of food are not permitted.

Washroom Use

- Students are to maintain physical distance at all times, where possible, when in the washroom
- Students are to wash/sanitize hands when they enter and exit the washroom
- Students are not to enter the washroom if the number of students exceed the number of stalls/urinals. Student is to wait in the hall
- Teachers will monitor who leaves their classroom for a washroom break
- Students are to leave the washroom immediately after finishing

Guidance Department

- Guidance will be offering face-to-face and virtual meetings
- Face to face meetings are by appointment only. No "drop-in" meetings permitted at this time
- Physical distancing will be maintained for pre-arranged face-to-face meetings. Students will wear a mask while attending a Guidance appointment

Lockers

- No lockers are being used until further notice. Students are asked to bring only what they need for their class
- No Gym lockers will be available for use until further notice

Study Hall

• Students may access Study Hall in the afternoons, for the purpose of using Wifi. Further information on this pending. Physical distancing is to be maintained at all times in accordance with Public Health regulations.

Dismissal

• Students are to leave school premises immediately after being dismissed from their face-to-face class unless they are remaining for Study Hall (quiet study).

Cleaning and Disinfection

 As part of the shared responsibility for health and safety, students will be responsible for cleaning and disinfecting personal items including laptops.

Student Timetables

Student timetables will be sent out sometime next week. We thank you for your patience at this time. We will be welcoming our Grade 9's on September 10th and 11th in the morning, followed by afternoon online learning for all grades.
