DETAILS FOR ORIENTATION

Orientation is an opportunity for students to:

- Learn more about the school and meet student leaders;
- Pay fees (if not done so already online); and
- Have their yearbook/student card photo taken.

All students require a Student Activity Card with their Photo on it. The purpose of this card is to enable students to use the school library and computer technology facilities and participate in school-related events.

Orientation Day Thursday, August 31 – 8:30 to 3:00 Photo Day

The busiest time tends to be 8:30 to 10:30. Avoid this time if possible.

Additional Opportunity to Have Picture Taken for Student Card/Yearbook

Students who are not able to come on August 31 to have their picture taken for their Student Card and the Yearbook will have the opportunity to do so on Wednesday, September 20.

Timetable Changes

Changes to timetables will not be made over the summer. Students will have the opportunity **to complete the required form to** <u>request necessary changes</u> starting September 1, 2017. Forms will be available in the Guidance Office and on our website and require the signature of a parent/guardian. Changes are not guaranteed and requests must meet the requirements outlined on the form provided by the Guidance Office. The Guidance office will process these requests between September 6 to 26. Students are to attend all classes on their timetable, even if they have requested a change.

Student/School Activity Fees

Student/school activity fees are voluntary amounts that are used to supplement a student's school experience through materials and activities such as student recognition programs, yearbooks, extracurricular activities, or theme days.

Sports Teams

There will be no school provision of monies for sports teams. Sports teams will operate on a cost recovery per team, per season with the student team players paying the individual required fees to participate on a team. Coaches will provide more information at tryouts.

Co-curricular Activities

Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular activities as part of their school experience. At SDSS, there are multiple opportunities for students to join student-lead clubs and organizations and sports teams. Students will be made aware of these activities through information fairs and morning announcements.

Health and Physical Education

All students participating in physical education classes and extra-curricular sports are required to wear appropriate SDSS athletic attire consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. Many students involve themselves in sports at SDSS. Plan to join them and get involved!

Dress Code

The York Region District School Board believes that school is a place of learning. To be successful, students must focus their attention and energy on school-related matters. For this reason, it is important that students dress appropriately.

Each school has its own dress code under the school's code of conduct. Students are expected to dress appropriately for learning in clothing that shows respect for self and others.

Clothing should meet the following guidelines:

- Clothing will not display inappropriate language or graphics.
- Shoulders, midriffs and undergarments must remain covered at all times.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.

Those who choose to wear clothing that does not conform to the code may be asked to:

- Turn the piece of clothing inside out;
- Wear something over the offending piece of clothing;
- Change into something else or remove the accessory;
- Give the offending item to the teacher, principal, or vice-principal; or
- Possibly go home to change.

Tobacco Smoke/Vape Free Environment

The York Region District School Board believes that all students and staff have the right to a safe and healthy learning and working environment. Through its mission, vision and values and in accordance with the *Smoke Free Ontario Act*, the Board provides a working and learning environment which is free from tobacco products. Smoking, Vaping and/or holding lit tobacco products, consuming or using any other tobacco product, is therefore prohibited on Board property or in personal vehicles parked on Board property.

Skateboards & Bicycles

Skateboards may not be used on school property. Students who use skateboards as transportation to and from school must, upon arrival on school property, pick them up and carry them to their locker where they must be stored during the school day. Bicycles are to be **locked** in the bicycle racks at the rear of the building and are not to be inside the school.
