Return of Textbooks and Technology

In an effort to ensure our school resources are fully stocked, we are asking families/students who have returned to in-person learning but have not yet returned their borrowed loaner device(s) (chromebooks and phones) and textbooks from the previous school year to please return them to the main office as soon as possible (this does NOT include SEA claim computers). Please remember that all power adapters and charger cords are to be returned with the device(s).

- If a student is a remote/on-line learner this year and has not returned the loaner device, they can continue to use the device as needed.
- If students have transferred to another YRDSB school for September 2021, their loaner device should be returned to the YRDSB school they attended when they received the technology.
- Any of our Grade 9 students who borrowed technology from their elementary school must return that technology to the school it was borrowed from.
- If you have a child who graduated last year please ensure that their items are also returned

 to login to the student account to complete the forms.
- The forms should be completed for each student, whether they are attending school in person or participating in remote, online learning.
- If you prefer to complete the forms on paper or have questions about the information in the forms, please contact the school office.
- Parents/guardians must complete a separate form for each child attending school. Please ensure you log out of
 one student account before logging into another. You will not be able to submit the form twice logged into the
 same student account.

Families are reminded to please notify the school when they know their child will be absent. In the case of students who attend school *in-person*, if they stay home for a day or two due to illness, please be advised that they are still required to be marked *absent* even if they are accessing materials on the Google Classroom.

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) Update

- As per the Ministry of Education, students graduating in the 2021-22 school year are exempt from the literacy graduation requirement
- Students in Grades 10 and 11 and non-graduating students, including those who are learning remotely, are required to work towards the literacy graduation requirement, through participating in the OSSLT or the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OSSLC). At this time, the York Region District School Board has decided that:
 - only eligible Grade 11 and non graduating Grade 12s will write in the fall
 - Grade 10 students will write in the spring
- Students will be supported in preparing through school- wide cross-curricular literacy activities
- Students and families can also access the <u>EQAO's practice test here</u> or the <u>SDSS Literacy Help Website here</u>

Student Medical and Mental Health Supports

The Mobile Youth Walk-In Clinic (MOBYSS) offers a safe space to talk to a medical or mental health professional in a warm, welcoming, and friendly environment. The mobile walk-in clinic is staffed by a nurse practitioner, youth mental health worker, and peer support specialist. Their services are 100% free and confidential with staff who are caring and non-judgmental. A health card is not required and there are no referral requirements. Students can book an appointment by emailing mobyss@cmha-yr.on.ca or by contacting MOBYSS at 289-879-2376. MOBYSS also offers virtual drop in clinics on Thursdays from 3-5pm.
