Return of Textbooks and Technology

In an effort to ensure our school resources are fully stocked, we are asking families/students who have returned to in-person learning but have not yet returned their borrowed loaner device(s) (chromebooks and phones) and textbooks from the previous school year to please return them to the main office as soon as possible. - If a student is a remote/on-line learner this year and has not returned the loaner device, they can continue to use the device as needed.
- If students have transferred to another YRDSB school for September 2021, their loaner device should be returned to the YRDSB school they attended when they received the technology.
- Any of our Grade 9 students who borrowed technology from their elementary school must return that technology to the school it was borrowed from.
- If you have a child who graduated last year please ensure that their items are also returned

School Start-Up Forms

- The forms should be completed for each student, whether they are attending school in person or participating in remote, online learning.
- If you prefer to complete the forms on paper or have questions about the information in the forms, please contact the school office.
- Parents/guardians must complete a separate form for each child attending school. Please ensure you log out
 of one student account before logging into another. You will not be able to submit the form twice logged into
 the same student account.

OTHER YRDSB PROGRAMS OFFERING CREDIT COURSES

Students who would like or need a course added to their current 2021-22 timetable can benefit from courses offered through the following YRDSB Programs. More information about the programs below and the course offerings is available on the Guidance Google Classroom (ljh6ex6) or the board website.

Night School

A remote learning model will replace in-person Night School this fall as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Classes will occur online using a synchronous model. Classes will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:30p.m. to 9:45p.m. and will run from October 5, 2021 to February 3, 2022. Students can register for a Night School course using My Pathway Planner (clicking on Continuing Education) and should submit a Sign Off Sheet with parent/guardian signatures to the Guidance office in order to be approved for the course.

Online Learning Night School

Night School Online Learning courses are specifically designed to be delivered in a fully online format. Classes will be delivered online using an asynchronous model. Weekly synchronous opportunities with teachers are available. These courses will run from September 21, 2021 to January 17, 2022. Students who have at least 1 spare on their timetable, can register for an Online Learning Night School course using My Pathway Planner (clicking on Continuing Education) and should submit a Sign Off Sheet with parent/guardian signatures to the Guidance office in order to be approved for the course.

Day School Online Learning (Semester 2 only)

Day School Online Learning courses are available semester 2 and are scheduled within the periods of the school day. Students must have at least 2 but less than 4 courses on their semester 2 timetable to enroll in a course. Classes will be delivered online using an asynchronous model with synchronous opportunities to meet with the teacher of the course. Students who wish to register for a Day School Online Learning course, should email Ms. Gray at erin.gray@yrdsb.ca and should also have a parent/guardian send an email giving permission. Ms. Gray will contact students once they have been registered in this program.

Dual Credit Program

Dual Credits allow students in secondary school to take college or apprenticeship courses that count towards both the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) and a postsecondary certificate, diploma, or degree, or an apprenticeship certification. Students who take a Dual Credit course:

- *Experience college while still in high school at no cost
- *Earn high school credits AND college credits at the same time in the same course
- *Learn in college state-of-the-art facilities
- *Explore different pathway options
- *Try something new
