

### ICD2O1 - Digital Technology and Innovations in the Changing World

This course helps students develop cutting-edge digital technology and computer programming skills that will support them in contributing to and leading the global economic, scientific and societal innovations of tomorrow. Students will learn and apply coding concepts and skills to build hands-on projects and investigate artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, and other emerging digital technologies that connect to a wide range of fields and careers. Using critical thinking skills with a focus on digital citizenship, students will investigate the appropriate use and development of the digital technologies that they encounter every day, as well as the benefits and limitations of these technologies.

This course will replace ICS2O1 - Introduction to Computer Studies



### Prerequisite Courses

- Many Grade 11 and 12 courses have a prerequisite (a required course to enter the course selected). When selecting courses, please ensure you have completed or are completing the prerequisite course(s).
  - Example: Grade 11 University Biology (SBI3U1) requires Grade 10 Academic Science (SNC2D1) as a prerequisite.
- Use <u>My Pathway Planner</u> to plan ahead. You may select Grade 11 & 12 courses now, but <u>only</u> your Grade 10 course selection will be submitted in February.





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
#### In February:

### Compulsory and Elective Credits

Be sure to check the Graduation Indicator on My Pathway Planner to ensure your course selection includes:

- all compulsory courses that you have not yet achieved (especially your Group credits)
- the courses that support (or are required for) your post-secondary program





- An Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) graduation requirement
- An after school literacy course is available to help you prepare for the test
- If you are unsuccessful on the test, you may rewrite the literacy test next year, or you may complete the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OSSLC)
- Speak to a guidance counsellor if you have any questions!





- 40 community hours are needed to graduate
- Best to finish before the end of Grade 10
- Prior to doing an activity, ensure that it is <u>eligible</u> (see back of the Community Hours sheet) and get it pre-approved through Guidance


