#### Please know that:

- your course selection determines which classes run next year
- you will need to <u>submit your course selection AND parent/guardian</u> <u>approval email on time</u> to receive equal consideration for the courses you have selected

#### **IMPORTANT Course Selection Information!!**

- Make informed and careful decisions when selecting your courses now
- An opportunity to make changes to your selections will occur after March break

## Timetable change requests in September 2024 will be restricted to students who:

- attended summer school
- have an incomplete timetable
- are making post-secondary or career pathway changes
- are missing a prerequisite course for their post-secondary or career pathway

## Graduation Requirements





#### 30 Compulsory & Elective School Credits

Be sure to check the "Graduation Indicator" on My Pathway Planner to ensure your course selection includes:

- all compulsory courses that you have not yet achieved (especially your Group 1, 2, and 3 required credits)
- the courses that support (or are required for) your post-secondary program







- Students may earn a maximum of 34 secondary school credits within 5 years of high school
  - Students may achieve more than 34 credits in their first 4 years of high school
  - Students who have an Individual Education Plan (IEP) are exempt from the threshold
  - English as a Second Language (ESL) courses are not included in calculating the credits
- Once a student reaches the 34 credit threshold, they may earn credits through online learning, night school, summer school, adult day school, etc.
- Repeated courses count <u>twice</u> towards the threshold
- More information on the 34 credit threshold can be found <u>here</u>.

## Community Involvement



- 40 community hours are needed to graduate
- Best to finish before the end of Grade 10
- Prior to doing an activity, ensure that it is <u>eligible</u> (see back of activity sheet) and get it pre-approved through Guidance
- Opportunities are advertised in the Guidance office, on Instagram (@sdss\_guidance), on the <u>SDSS Guidance Website</u> and the <u>SDSS</u> <u>Guidance Google Classroom</u>







- An Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) graduation requirement
- An after school literacy course is available to help you prepare for the test
- If you have written the test at least once prior to grade 12 but have not been successful, we recommend that you complete the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OLC4O1) to meet this graduation requirement
- Speak to a guidance counsellor as soon as possible to discuss your options!





## Online Learning Graduation Requirement

- Students must earn **two asynchronous Online Learning credits** to graduate
- This should not pose a barrier to graduation since you may choose to <u>opt</u>
   <u>out</u> of this graduation requirement
- The <u>opt out process is incorporated into the student course selection</u>
   <u>process</u>. Students may also contact the main office to opt out of this
   requirement during other times in the school year
- Students can choose to opt back into the online learning graduation requirement should their decision change

- Students must be enrolled as full-time
   (must take at least 3 courses per semester)
- Select at least 7 courses next year + 2 alternates
- One spare is permitted if you have achieved at least 23 credits
- To choose a spare, leave one of your courses blank
- Pick alternates wisely as they may be used in creating your timetable !!

#### Cooperative Education



- Allows students the opportunity to earn credits through experiential learning in a workplace setting
- Options include:
  - Teaching Assistant (COOP1), Half Day (COOP2) or Full Day (COOP4)
  - HPA:High Performance Athlete Program (Sem 1 HPA11, Sem 2 HPA21)
  - OYAP/Accelerated OYAP: Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (COOP4)
  - Militia Co-op (COOP4)

- This program combines in-school courses with experiential learning through cooperative education and sector based certifications
- Opportunities for ALL pathways (university, apprenticeship, college)
- Indicate your interest on My Pathway Planner under the SHSM Planner tab located on the right hand side under the graduation indicator
- <u>Applications</u> for SHSM should be completed with your course selections in February
- At SDSS we offer SHSM programs in Health & Wellness and Business

- This program allows students the opportunity to attend college while still in high school
- The government covers the cost of tuition, transportation and books
- Students earn a college credit AND an associated high school credit

- Available to students in Grade 11 (Semester 2 only) and Grade 12

## Post-Secondary Planning





College and University application process begins in the fall!

Guidance will inform you of the process, and will support you on your journey.

#### What can you do to prepare?

- Set realistic post-secondary goals that are well-suited to YOU!
- Research admission requirements for apprenticeships, college and/or university programs
- Create a post-secondary education plan that includes several options
- Develop questions for Guidance counsellors and/or college and university reps
- Attend (in person and/or virtual) post-secondary fairs or apprenticeship events
- Visit college and university campuses and/or apprenticeship workplaces & websites

- Requirements for Apprenticeship programs:
  - Most trades require a high school diploma
  - Some require or prefer strong knowledge of math and science
  - Must acquire employment with a company/journeyperson to begin apprenticeship training

#### Notes:

- OYAP (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program) allows grade 11 or 12 students to start apprenticing for a skilled trade while they are in high school
- Pre-apprenticeship programs through high school, colleges, trade schools and the Ontario government allow students to explore skilled trades prior to starting an apprenticeship
- Employment for apprenticeships can be found through networking (family, friends, etc), trade unions, training institutions, employment offices and/or websites such as <u>Monster.ca</u>, <u>indeed.com</u> and <u>apprenticesearch.com</u>.

- Requirements for College Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma programs:
  - High school diploma
  - Grade 12 College English for most programs
- Requirements for College Degree programs:
  - High school diploma
  - 6 Grade 12 U/M courses are required
- Notes:
  - Admission averages are varied by school and program dependent (check the website)
  - Programs may have prerequisite courses
  - Programs may require supplementary information (i.e. portfolio, interview)
  - Some schools may require an English Proficiency Test for those students who first language is not English





#### University Program and Admission Information: www.ontariouniversititesinfo.ca

- Requirements for University Degree programs:
  - High school diploma
  - 6 Grade 12 U/M courses are required
  - Minimum 70% average

#### Notes:

- Many programs will have a much higher admission average
- Some programs require as many as 5 specific Grade 12 U (University) courses as prerequisites
- Some universities have a maximum number of "M" level courses that they will accept as part of the top 6 marks
- Some programs may require supplementary information (i.e. portfolio, interview)
- Some schools may require an English Proficiency Test for those students who first language is not English


Log in to <u>My Pathway Planner</u> using your GAPPS username and password.

- You will notice an "Online Learning Opt-Out" course has been added to your planner




#### My Pathway Planner: Choosing Courses

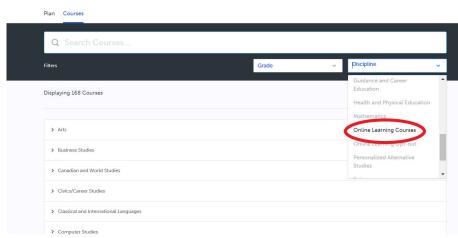






#### My Pathway Planner: Adding Online Courses

- You may take a maximum of 2 online courses across your grade 11 and 12 year

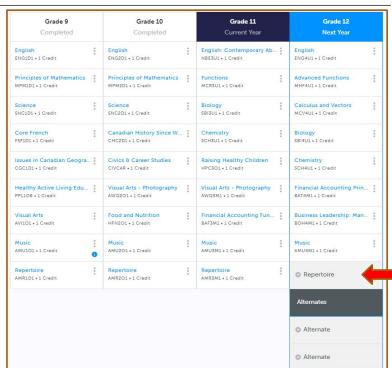

#### My Pathway Planner: Prerequisite Courses

Many courses have a prerequisite (a prior course needed to enter the course selected). When selecting courses, please ensure you have completed or are completing any prerequisite course(s). Grade 12

Example: Grade 12 University Data Management (MDM4U1) requires Grade 11 University Functions (MCR3U1) OR Grade 11 Mixed Mathematics (MCF3M1).

If you select a course and are missing the necessary BAF3M1 • 1 Credit BAT4M1 • 1 Credit prerequisite, a red exclamation mark will appear next to the selected course

Use My Pathway Planner to plan ahead. You may select Grade 12 courses for post-secondary planning purposes, but only your Grade 11 course selections will be submitted in February.






#### In February:

- pick a replacement elective course for the course you would like to be taking at summer school

#### In the spring:

 you will need to officially <u>register for summer</u> <u>school</u>

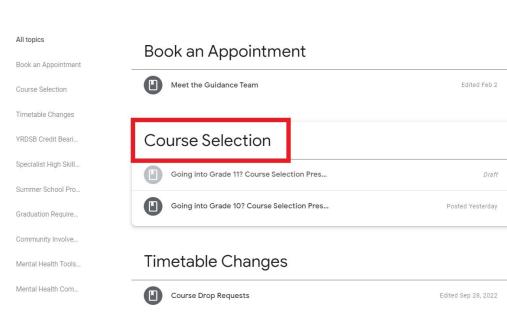
