Mythbusters!



Guidance has been hearing a few things that aren't factual:

- Early offers do not exist.
 - Some schools simply extend offers of admission earlier than others based on programs, geographic location, etc. There is nothing you can do (or have to do) to get an "early" offer
- The application deadline is January 15, 2025.
 - Apply when you are ready do not rush yourself!
- Supplementary application are not completed ahead of your applications.
 - You have to apply first and receive welcome emails and details for a supplementary application IF your program/university requires one.

Applying to Ontario Universities

3-Step Process

- 1. Preparing to apply

Preparing to Apply













Step 1: Research Your University Options

- Visit **OUInfo** (<u>www.ouinfo.ca</u>) to find what each university has to offer.
- Read the Undergraduate Application Guide
 (www.ouac.on.ca/undergrad-guide) for
 up-to-date information about universities and programs.
- Check out university publications and websites.
- Talk to counsellors, family, teachers and friends.
- Write down your program choices and codes and keep them handy.

Step 2: Get Your OEN

You will need your Ontario Education Number (OEN) to apply.

The OEN is a 9-digit, unique identification number assigned to elementary and high school students across the province.

You can find your OEN on your report card or check your GAPPS email during the week of October 15th. The board will be emailing you with your OEN # and the school's MIDENT #.

Your high school guidance counsellor will also have it on record.

Step 3: Mark Your Calendar

- Late September 2024: The Undergraduate application opens.
- January 15, 2025: Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.
- May 29, 2025: Last day you can expect a response from an Ontario university if you applied by the January 15 deadline.
- June 2, 2025: The earliest day you may be required to respond to an offer and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration or residence deposit).


You must include **all** high schools you attended from Grades 9 to 12, including 0 international high schools.

You do not need to include institutions where your home high school registered you for courses, e.g., board virtual school, dual credit, Specialist High Skills Major, e-learning through a consortium.



Paying for Your Application




Once you complete your payment, you will receive your OUAC Reference Number.

- On the Complete page, print the screen displaying your OUAC Reference Number (2025-XXXXXX) and instructions. You will also receive an email.
- Record your OUAC Reference Number, as you will need to include it when communicating with the OUAC and the



Applying Out of Province

The OUAC assists the following out-of-province universities with collecting academic data for Ontario high school students who have applied through the OUAC:

- Acadia University
- Bishop's University
- University of British Columbia
- Concordia University
- Dalhousie University
- McGill University
- Saint Mary's University
- Simon Fraser University
- University of Victoria

Students who apply to these out-of-province universities can authorize the universities to request their academic information from the OUAC. To authorize, the applicant must include their 11-digit OUAC Reference Number on the institution's application form.


In all cases, the 11th digit should be "0".

Applying to Royal Military College (RMC)

RMC, located in Kingston, Ontario, is not part of the OUAC's processing services. A separate form and additional application materials must be obtained from a Canadian Forces Recruiting Centre.

Non-YRDSB Courses

Summer school, night school and online courses plus repeated and upgraded courses

- Most schools accept these marks equally. Some schools do not.
- Please check out the <u>OUInfo</u> program page for specifics at your chosen universities to verify these types of courses

Private School Courses

- Guidance should be informed of any private school courses you take
- The <u>private school MUST</u> upload your course(s) and mark(s) onto OUAC
- Final report cards must be received by SDSS by **Thursday**, **June 12**, **2025** so we can verify and record prior to graduation

University Portals

You should receive two emails from each university to which you apply:

- 1st email: generic welcome email (usually within 24 hours)
- 2nd email: site specific login information (usually within 7-14 school days)

Specific messages, updates and requirements

- Important due dates and deadlines
- Program specific requirements
- Language proficiency requirements (i.e. IELTS, TOFEL, etc.)
- Scholarship and bursary information
- Tuition deposit and payment information
- Residence requirements and applications
- Course selection/timetable creation information (late spring/early summer)

Supplementary Applications

You should review the supplementary requirements on the portal sites.

- Many universities require (or strongly recommend) a supplementary application, such as Queen's PSE, Ivey @ Western, TMU's Grades-Plus program, most Fine Arts and Concurrent Education Programs.
- Be sure to read all email communication (on portal sites) from the universities you've applied to so you know whether there are additional requirements to your application.
- Be aware of specific deadlines for any additional requirements!

Offers of Admission

Conditional Offers

- When you accept an offer, it is conditional upon meeting the requirements outlined by the university
- This means that you must continue to work hard right through to the completion of your semester 2 courses in June
- An offer WILL be revoked if you do not meet the conditions outlined

Alternate Offers

- Check with the university to see if they offer alternate offer to the programs you are applying. You do not have to apply to this alternate program, it happens automatically (i.e. Brock Phys.Ed ▷ Rec. Program)
- Not all schools offer automatic alternative programs

OSAP

Everyone SHOULD apply for OSAP

- OSAP application will open in 2025
- Try out the <u>OSAP Aid Estimator</u> to see what you could be eligible for (an estimate)
- OSAP is comprised of government grants and loans (free money vs. money to pay back)
- You will need the annual income of your household
