Courses in the Music Department

AMUIO1 - Day Class Experienced - for those who HAVE played a concert band instrument in elementary school

AMU1O2 - Day Class Beginner - for those who have NOT played a concert band instrument in elementary school

AMRIO1 - Band Rep. Class - after school band class for those *taking* AMUIO1 OR AMUIO2 *This is to be taken* <u>as well as</u> the AMU course.

AMR1O3 - Vocal Rep. Class - before school vocal class

These repertoire classes will be a 9th credit over & above your regular 8 day classes.

*Please note students may only select one repertoire credit however they may be in both band and choir. Their repertoire mark will be a combination of the two ensembles. We have lots of concerts, go to festivals and go on road trips like playing at Markham fair.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I take more than one arts credit in grade 9?

Absolutely! You may take drama (ADA) or visual art (AVI) as well as music (AMU&AMR). You just need to make sure you cover all your Group 1, 2 and 3 requirements in your four years.

If band is after school can I still do sports/other clubs?

We believe that a well rounded student is the best student. We work hard with athletics and clubs to ensure that people can do everything. If there is a conflict then you can speak to both teachers in charge and we will find a compromise.

What is the repertoire (AMR) credit and does it take up one of my elective spots?


The repertoire course is either the band or the vocal credit that occurs outside of the timetable. This is an extra credit and you can take it <u>in addition</u> to your two other electives.

If I am a beginner should I take band?

Of course!! Every year our beginners join our band and are very successful! We will work with you in small groups until you are comfortable and ready to be a part of the whole band.







Science Pathways: OSSD 2 required credits in grade 9 and 10 Many options for grade 11 and 12

This chart maps out all the courses in the discipline and shows the links between courses and the prerequisites for them. It does not attempt to depict all possible movements from course to course.








Broad Based Technology with seven different pathways .

1 - **Communications Technology** - Students develop skills in, photography, studio lighting, video production and, audio production using current industry software and equipment.

2 - Computer Engineering Technology - Students learn about and work hands on with computer hardware, robotics and programming.
