Guide to reading an Ontario Student Status Sheet

On the back of this sheet is a copy of your Ontario Student Status. This document is used by secondary schools to track your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) requirements as you progress through secondary school. This document is not to be confused with an Ontario Student Transcript, which is used for post-secondary institutions, employers and a number of other purposes. Please check this document carefully to ensure all the information is accurate and that you are either on track or meeting your OSSD requirements.

Please check for the following OSSD requirements:

- Community Involvement Hours: minimum of 40 hours required
- Online Learning Graduation Requirement - Students must complete TWO of their 30 credits as an Online Learning course OR opt-out of the requirement. Please see Guidance for more information.
- Ontario Secondary School Literacy Requirement - Either by passing the literacy test or taking the literacy course (OLC40)
- 18 Compulsory Credits
- 12 Optional Credits

If you have a question or a concern that your Ontario Student Status is not accurate, please book an appointment to see your Guidance Counsellor.

Personal Information - Identifying information, student number and OEN.

Current Year Courses - Courses currently enrolled in.

Credit Summary - Tracks compulsory and optional credits. There are two sides. An earned/previous side on the left and a potential on the right. Check to ensure you have all of your compulsory and optional credits earned to date. If you are planning to graduate this school year, they will need to add up to 30 by June.

If you enroll in a non-YRDSB course, it is your responsibility to ensure that the institution reports your marks to OJAC & OCAS at the appropriate transmission times.

If you complete any non-YRDSB course, it is your responsibility to ensure Guidance receives an official transcript or report card from the institution prior to June 1st.

- Fees:
 - **\$156.00 for three choices**
 - Applicants who wish to select additional programs or universities beyond the first three choices must pay **\$50.00** for each additional selection
 - **International service fee:** \$10
 - **Supplemental Program Fees:** some universities charge additional fees for certain programs to cover the cost of individual faculty admission processes; it is non-refundable and you pay it along with your OUAC application fee
