

A teaching and learning environment in which each participating student and teacher has access to a personal computing device on a direct and continuous basis for educational purposes.

Students do not share their technology with other students but take ownership over their own device.

PURPOSE: To improve student learning and engagement and to teach students how to be critical thinking CREATORS with technology rather than passive CONSUMERS of technology

Why is a 1:1 program beneficial?

ASSULT

1. Students are already engaged with technology

- Now we need to teach them how to use it purposefully
- If students are required to use technology in the classroom, then it won't act as a distraction to the learning process

2. Technology is an integral part of future careers

- We aim to equip students with the skills they need to use technology in a meaningful and constructive way

3. Decrease inequities

 Currently, many teachers and students are using technology on a regular basis, this ensures equal access for it a learning tool



Credit Requirements for graduation

30 Credits: 17 Compulsory Credits and 13 Optional Credits

Compulsory credits are comprised of the following:

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
- 3 credits in Mathematics (Grade 9 & 10 plus 1 in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Technological Education (Grade 9 or 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian History (Grade 10)
- credit in Canadian Geography (Grade 9)

- credit in The Arts
 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a Second Language
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics & Citizenship
- 1 credit from the STEM-Related Course Group



STEM-Related Course Group


You must complete ONE from the following group:

- Business Studies
- Computer Studies
- Cooperative Education***
- · Mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- · Science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- Technological Education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)

In addition, students must complete:

- 13 optional credits 4 can be earned through Dual Credit programs
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- The Provincial Literacy Requirement (OSSLT or OSSLC)
- Earn at least 2 credits through Online Learning**
