Step 1A: Research University Options



- Visit OUInfo Ontario Universities' Info
- Watch <u>How to Use OUInfo</u>
- Follow the <u>University Research Checklist OUInfo</u>
- Review the <u>101 Application Guide</u> for up-to-date information about the universities and their programs.
- Check out university publications and websites.
- Talk to counsellors, family, teachers and friends.
- Reach out to university/program admissions advisors
- Write down your program choices and codes and keep them handy.

Step 1B: Research University Options



- Make use of <u>Common University Data Ontario</u>
- CUDO offers key data, in a common format, about Ontario's universities:
 - Number of degrees awarded, student enrolment and entering averages all by program;
 - Number of students living on campus and activities offered;
 - Student satisfaction;
 - First-year tuition and ancillary fees by program;
 - Number of teaching faculty;
 - Undergraduate class size, by year level;
 - Research awards granted; and
 - Graduation rates and employment rates by program.

CUDO has been designed to provide data that has been gathered on a consistent basis for the public to have access to information about each university.

Step 2: OUAC PIN Distribution at SDSS

- Your confidential PIN was emailed to your GAPPS account on October 29, 2020. <u>Please let us know as soon as possible if</u> you did NOT receive it.
- Log yourself in and have a look around!
- Please review your academic data (courses and marks)
 across the school year. It is your responsibility to ensure
 your information is accurate and up to date
- Please inform Guidance immediately if there are any concerns regarding the accuracy of your academic and personal data

Step 3A: Mark Your Calendar

October 29, 2020

» Access codes are provided for the 101 application.

January 15, 2021

» Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.

May 27, 2021:

» Last day you can expect a response from on Ontario university if you applied by the January 15 deadline.

June 1, 2021:

» The earliest day you may be required to respond to an offer and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration or residence deposit, etc.).





 Please be advised that your changes will not be saved.




2. Online Banking:

1. OSAP

- OSAP application for 2021-2022 year is now open, and can be linked to your OUAC application.
- OSAP is comprised of government grants and loans (free money vs. need to pay back).
- Try out the OSAP Aid Estimator to see what you could be eligible for (an estimate).
- You will need to know the annual income of your household.
- ALL students should apply for OSAP.

2. Institution Portal / Intranet Site

- You should receive two emails from each university to which you apply:
 - 1st email: generic welcome email (usually within 24 hours)
 - 2nd email: site specific login information (usually within 7 days)

Institution Portal / Intranet Site cont'd

Regularly check each university site for program specific messages, updates & requirements:

- important due dates and deadlines
- program specific requirements
- language proficiency requirements
- scholarship and bursary applications
- tuition deposit and tuition payment information
- residence requirements and links
- course selection/timetable creation (late spring/early summer)

3. Applying to Out-of-Province Universities

The following universities are connected with OUAC for mark transmission:

- Acadia University
- Bishop's University
- The University of British Columbia
- The University of Calgary
- Concordia University
- Dalhousie University
- McGill University
- Saint Mary's University
- Simon Fraser University
- The University of Victoria

Students who apply to these out-of-province universities can authorize the universities to request their academic information from the OUAC. To authorize, the applicant must include their 11-digit OUAC Reference Number on the institution's application form.

4. Private School Marks

- Your counsellor should be informed about a private school course that you are taking.
- The private school must upload your course(s) and mark(s) onto your OUAC account.
- When you are finished your course(s), please have the institution mail your report card to the SDSS Guidance department so that we can update your academic data and ensure your graduation requirements are met.

5. Alternate Offers

- Check with the individual school to see if they offer
 alternative offers to the programs you are applying. You do
 not have to apply to this program, it happens automatically.
 (e.g. Brock Phys.ed → Rec. Program)
- Not all schools offer automatic alternative programs.

6. Conditional Offers

- When you accept an offer, it is conditional upon the requirements as outlined by the university.
- This means that you must continue to work hard right through to the completion of your final course marks in June.
- Offers will be revoked if a student does not meet the outlined conditions.

7. Supplementary Applications

- Many universities require (or strongly recommend) a supplementary application, such as Queen's PSE, Ivey @ Western, Ryerson's Grades-Plus programs, most Fine Arts and Concurrent Education Programs.
- Be sure to read all email communication (on the intranet site) from the universities you've applied to in order to know whether there are additional requirements to your application.
- Be aware of the specific deadlines for any additional requirements!

8. Repeated, summer school, or upgraded courses

- Most schools accept these marks equally. Some schools do not.
- Please check the OUInfo program page for specifics.
