## CHARACTER MATTERS AT SUTTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Providing students with an opportunity to learn and develop in a safe and respectful community is a shared responsibility in which school boards and schools play an important role. At Sutton Public School we have bullying prevention and intervention strategies that foster a positive learning and teaching environment that supports academic achievement for all students and that helps students reach their full potential.

A positive school climate is a crucial component of prevention; it may be defined as the sum total of all of the personal relationships within a school. When these relationships are founded in mutual acceptance and inclusion, and modeled by all, a culture of respect becomes the norm. A positive school climate exists when all members of the school community feel safe, comfortable, and accepted. To help achieve a positive environment, boards and schools should actively promote and support positive behaviours that reflect their character development initiatives. They should also endeavour to ensure that parents and members of the broader community are involved in the school community. (excerpt taken from Policy/Program Memorandum NO. 144 "Bullying Prevention and Intervention")

This month we are reviewing our Positive Climates for Learning and Healthy Schools documents. Our school challenge of practice addresses our work with teaching students how to self regulate so they are learning how to learn and create positive and healthy environments. 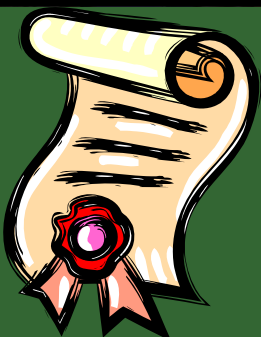
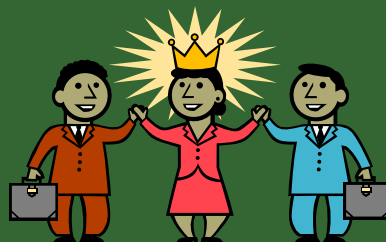
## Heart for Hope Fundraiser
