As mentioned in March's newsletter, teaching your child to be critical readers is an important skill, especially with the many apps and sites available on the internet. Parents can support the development of critical literacy skills. YRDSB highlights some key points regarding the definition of critical literacy.

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Critical literacy means....

- Recognizing that texts contain certain perspectives and biases
- Analyzing that point of view influences how a text is interpreted and understood
- Determining whose voices are present or absent
- Evaluating multiple perspectives for bias, reliability, fairness and validity
- Analyzing how language is used
- Taking a stance and engage in a response in the interest of equity, fairness and social justice
- Using technology to seek divergent perspectives, interact with authentic audiences, and express ideas

It is important that we engage our children in a home reading routine. Reading together with your child will develop positive reading habits. Family read-alouds support the development of reading skills and parents are important sources of information. Reading critically means taking the time to discuss the issues raised in the book and asking questions about how they are interpreting what is being read. Children can sign out books at our library. Also make use of the Sutton library and teach your children how to enjoy reading a good book.


