Beginning next month, all YRDSB elementary schools will have installed a front door security system as part of the 'Safe Welcome Program'. Please join us in ensuring that our school continues to be a safe place to welcome our parents and community members as we move towards the 'Safe Welcome Program'.

Recently we have had some very cold days at school and parents have asked how we decide whether children go outside for recess. Generally, we will not send children out at all if it is colder than -20C. Between -10C and -20C we will try and send the children out for some time. Above -10C we will send children out for the full recess. Please understand that this is a loose guideline and that other factors such as icy conditions, sun or cloud and heavy snowfall, may alter the duration of the time spent outside. The most important thing students can do is be prepared – proper mitts/ gloves, a hat, snow pants, etc. Please label all clothing so they don't end up on the Lost and Found table. If you are in need of winter clothing, please contact the school. We may be able to help!

Students with health concerns, such as, but not limited to, heavy colds, coughs and flu, which are serious enough to prevent them from participating in physical education, recesses or other outdoor activities, should remain at home until the condition improves. Kindergarten Registration for September 2014

Kindergarten registration will commence on January 17, 2014 for the 2014-15 school year. Registration forms are available on YRDSB's website: <u>www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca</u>. Children who turn four or five years old during 2014, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten. A kindergarten information session for parents is being planned for this spring.

French Immersion Registration September 2014

Information sessions for the French Immersion (FI) program will take place at Keswick Public School on January 16, 2014 at 7 p.m. FI registration will begin January 17, 2014. In order to streamline the registration process, parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2014, and wishing to enrol in the FI Program, can visit or call the school office and request an *Office Index Card* - *short version*. The Office Index Card must be signed by the principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to Sutton Public School to register between January 17 and February 14, 2014. This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrollment

information or to pre-register.

YRDSB's FI Accommodation Plan provides long-term consistency and equity of access to all students in York Region and will enable YRDSB to continue to offer the FI program to all who wish to enrol. The FI program will be offered in Dual Track or Single Track settings, in a variety of configurations. In order to meet community needs and optimize available space in our schools, a community's Grade 1-8 FI program may be provided over more than one school during the course of a student's FI education. This will allow flexibility in addressing community needs and the opportunity to use existing space in schools. More information is available on the Board's website: <u>www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca</u>. Please note: Some of the FI accommodation plans will require facility modifications or the development of new schools and will require short-term transition plans that might include overflow while we work toward the long-term vision. Overflow refers to situations in which the Board directs students to attend a school other than their community school or optional program for a specific period of time, as defined in Policy #108.

Locked School Doors

Beginning February 3, all school doors, including the front doors and doors to portables, will be locked 15 minutes after the morning entry bell. The doors will remain locked for the rest of the day. Anyone arriving at the school after that time must buzz in and sign in at the main office.

Measures will also be put in place for parents/guardians to buzz in and pick up students participating in before and after school programs.

Our school continues to be a safe place where parent and community member involvement is welcomed and encouraged. This additional step will enhance the measures we already have in place, and ensure that all visitors sign in at the main office upon arrival.


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The Chess Club!!!
