HOMEWORK HELP!

Learning how to follow a homework routine helps children develop responsibility and organization. These life skills are important because it teaches students how

to manage their time, follow directions, and complete work to the best of their abilities. Parents can help make homework time a positive learning experience by:

- 1. Create a space for your child to do their homework every night that is well lit and quiet. Make sure that there are no distractions, like television or phone calls, during this time.
- 2. Choose a consistent time every evening that both the child and parents agree upon. It may not be the best time to schedule homework when they know their friends are outside

playing or during their favourite show. Make it routine.

3. Parents need to observe their child's homework habits. Are they making the best use of

their homework time? If they get stuck on a question, can they figure out where to look for help? Parents can help their child get started, ensure they have the materials they need, and let them know that they can ask for support if needed...but don't do the work for them! This is their time to learn and they need to 'learn how to learn'!

4. Make the experience a positive one. Praise them when they are following the homework

- routine. Don't criticize when they make a mistake. Making a mistake and learning from it
- is an important part of the learning.
- 5. Communicate with your child's teacher. Find the best method to keep in touch.
- 6. If there isn't an assignment or homework due, let your child **READ** and talk about what they are reading. There are many articles on the internet that your child can read that will

interest them. Help them to become critical readers so that they question the opinion of

other writers and question the accuracy of what they are reading.

April's newsletter will address how to support your child in becoming a critical reader.


