## **Principal's Message:**

We have implemented our gradual entry 'start of the day' program and everything is going well. Students have time to visit the breakfast program and go to their coat hooks and lockers to prepare their material for the day. When the bell rings at 8:10 students are ready for the learning to begin. There has been a misunderstanding which I would like to address. School starts at 8:10 am but we allow students into the school starting at 7:55 am. This is also the time students are let off the bus in the mornings. Staff supervision does not begin until 7:55 am so students cannot be in the school until then unless they are in the daycare program. Prior to 7:55 the child is under the parent's supervision. I hope this clarifies the timelines. It is about keeping the students safe and properly supervised.

Another issue continues to be the Kiss & Ride. Unfortunately, when the school was built the size of the parking lot was established. The staff at Sutton did not monitor the traffic flow in and out of the school. School council asked us to get involved because of the congestion in the parking lot and out on the street as cars try to enter. We have tried to keep the flow of the traffic moving by creating procedures for the Kiss & Ride area, for example:

- 1. If you need to get out of your car to help your child, please park. We need to make sure the Kiss & Ride is for a quick drop off only.
- 2. Students can only get out on the sidewalk section so they are not opening car doors or walking where cars are trying to drive past.

3. Please pull up as far as you can so the drivers behind can also let off their children.

If you have any ideas that might help please let us know. The Kiss & Ride appears to be working most days but there are numerous cars trying to get in to drop off their children, especially on rainy days. We are doing our best to keep the flow of traffic moving for all parents.

March Break is a week away so this month will pass by quickly. Many clubs, team sports, and activities are occurring at Sutton Public School to keep our students active and socializing with their peers. Talk with your child in the evenings about everything they are doing at school!

We have had some staffing changes. Mr. Counter is teaching Ms. Minielly's class because she is now a vice principal in the Bluewater District School Board. Mrs. O'Reilly has returned from her maternity leave and is excited to be back with her class. As we begin our second term, parents can support their children by ensuring that they are communicating with their child's teacher and that a school work routine is set up at home. #### Eco-School News: Watch out for snow snakes!

Students in the the eco-club were invited to join Mr. Jaski's class in participate in the snow snake program that was presented by veteran outdoor educator, Ian Faulds. He volunteered two days of his time to teach students to this traditional aboriginal game. We learned about the game through discussion and a National Film Board short documentary about the Six Nations Reserve near Brantford. First, the group built up a snow snake track on a beautiful snowy day. After the snow had set for a few days the group went back out to create the track and begin racing their snakes. The snakes are actually made out of wood and are varnished and sometimes waxed to help them travel farther. Teams representing the provinces and territories then competed to see who could throw the farthest. Good fun and many laughs were had by all, which was the whole point of the game over the hundreds of years that it has been played.

## **Parent Math Tips**

- Build strong, positive attitudes about math. When children feel positively engaged and successful, they are more likely to stick with an activity or a problem to find a solution.
- Begin with activities that meet your child's level of mathematical understanding. Early success in solving problems will build your child's confidence. Gradually move to activities that provide more challenge.
- If you and your child are more comfortable in a language other than English, use it. Your child will understand concepts better in the language that he/she knows best.
