COURAGE

The Remembrance Day Service was held today at 1:30pm so we could honour the veterans who attended. I would ask that tomorrow, November 11th, that everyone remember the men and women who have fought in times of war. As we honour the soldiers who fought in the World Wars, it is important that we recognize the men and women who are currently serving overseas. This is also the 59th anniversary of the United Nations' peacekeeping efforts. Students can make a donation tomorrow to the veterans if they wish. On Wednesday, November 11th, we will also have a minute of silence at 11:00am.

How can parents support the learning in the classroom at home? Students are more successful when parents are actively involved in their child's education. What are some things parents can do? Find a method of communication with the teacher to keep updated with classroom activities. Make sure your child has an area to do their homework at the same time every evening that is welllit, quiet, and has the necessary supplies. Have snacks and water available for breaks. Make sure your child does their own work or they won't learn how to think for themselves and correct their own mistakes. The process of learning is more important than the correct answer. Talk to your child about upcoming assignments, tests, due dates and be there if they get stuck or have a question. Praise their effort! Perseverance is one of the skills that support an alert learner. If your child continues to have problems, even with your support, talk about it with the teacher. Let your child talk about their thinking and listen to how they justify their answers. This is how children develop a deep understanding and "learn how to learn."

The development of oral language skills is important as it shows us how well students have learned to communicate. For younger children, they need many opportunities for language development. They need to be challenged to talk and answer questions as they attempt to make meaning of what is occurring around them. Make sure your child feels they have something worthwhile to say. Spend time having conversations with them. Ask them about their thoughts and then get them to repeat the thoughts of others. Try to steer away from the one word answers. Ask questions like, "What do you think is happening in this picture?" Before children start school their language growth is

Elementary Safe Arrival and Departure Program

The safety of our students is a priority. Our safe arrivals programs and safe departures protocols are in place so that we can account for the whereabouts of absent students.

Parents/guardians, inform your child's school if your child is going to be absent or late to school or at an after-school event that he or she has planned to attend. Where possible, notify the school in advance. Call the school and leave a message on the answering machine or with the office.

If you have not informed the school of your child's absence in advance, the school will take the following steps, in this order, to ensure your child is safe:

- 1. We will call your home.
- 2. If we do not reach you at home, we will call your work and/or cell phone.
- 3. If we cannot reach you at work, we will call your emergency contact number.
- 4. If we cannot get information from your emergency contact about your child's location, we will speak to a sibling if one is in the school.
- 5. If we are still unable to get information, we may check with a friend of your child.
- 6. If we are still unable to get information, we will consider your child missing and we will contact York Regional Police.
