Such authentic family-school partnerships are focused on improving attitudes to school and enhancing students' future success; they are engaged in what Ken Leithwood calls "co-producing learning" (Webcasts for Educators, 2012).

Parents' Corner – Asking Questions

Did you know that by asking open-ended questions you can help your child do better at school? Ontario's curriculum is divided into 4 achievement categories: Knowledge and Understanding, Thinking, Communication, and Application. By asking our students to articulate their thinking as they apply their knowledge and understanding to solve real-world problems, we are addressing all four areas of the achievement chart. Our students need to be able to justify their thinking. You can help them develop this skill by asking ques-


Encourage these kinds of conversations throughout your daily routines.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

How can parents support the learning in the classroom at home? Students are more successful when parents are actively involved in their child's education. What are some things parents can do? Find a method of communication with has an area to do their homework at the same time every evening that is welllit, quiet, and has the necessary supplies. Have snacks and water available for breaks. Make sure your child does their own work or they won't learn how to think for themselves and correct their own mistakes. The process of learning is more important than the correct answer. Talk to your child about upcoming assignments, tests, due dates and be there if they get stuck or have a question. Praise their effort! Perseverance is one of the skills that support an alert learner. If your child continues to have problems, even with your support, talk about it with the teacher. Let your child talk about their thinking and listen to

Elementary Safe Arrival and Departure Program

The safety of our students is a priority. Our safe arrivals programs and safe departures protocols are in place so that we can account for the whereabouts of absent students.

Parents/guardians, inform your child's school if your child is going to be absent or late to school or an after-school event that he or she has planned to attend. Where possible, notify the school in advance. Call the school and leave a message on the answering machine or with the office.

If you have not informed the school of your child's absence in advance, the school will take the following steps, in this order, to ensure your child is safe:

- 1. We will call your home.
- 2. If we do not reach you at home, we will call your work and/or cell phone.
- 3. If we cannot reach you at work, we will call your emergency contact number.
- 4. If we cannot get information from your emergency contact about your child's location, we will speak to a sibling if one is in the school.
- 5. If we are still unable to get information, we may check with a friend of your child.
- 6. If we are still unable to get information, we will consider your child missing and we will contact York Regional Police.
